#### Rules of the Lottery:

- All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for their choice of country assignment.
- After each participating school has been assigned one delegation in the first round, those schools that registered for more than one delegation will receive an additional assignment in a subsequent round, until all registration requests have been fulfilled.
- Lottery applications are due on Sunday, 19 November before 9:00 p.m. in the Ohio Room.
- A non-refundable \$75 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2018 fees.
- In addition to receiving an early country selection, participating schools will also receive a \$5.00 per delegate discount for the 2018 AMUN Conference.







The Mayfair Room will be open to Faculty Advisors for use outside of scheduled AMUN events.



Pollution is the #1 killer in the world today, and new reports say the consequences of global warming will come sooner and be more catastrophic than expected if we fail to act in time.


## ❖ With his help we will see that all life is one...



## SHERATON GRAND HOTEL VENUE MAP








## SHERATON GRAND HOTEL VENUE MAP


