SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Integration of Gender and Human Rights of Women SUBMITTED TO: The Economic and Social Council SUBMITTED BY: Rwanda, United States, Benin, Morocco, Mexico, Germany The Economic and Social Council Bearing in mind the principles and values regarding the encouragement and maintenance of peace put forth in the Charter of the United Nations and the belief in the equal rights of men and women in the Universal Declaration on Human Rights, Noting the responsibility of the United Nations and all its members to honor the commitments of the Beijing Declaration and Platform (A/52/231) and its implementation concerning the equality of women and their fundamental rights as members of the human family, Recalling the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence Against Women regarding its demands for protection of the dignity of women from all forms of violence, particularly rape, trafficking of women and young girls, and domestic abuse, in both the domestic and international arenas, Reaffirming the obligations of all states to promote and protect human rights and fundamental freedoms in both domestic and foreign affairs, Recalling the spirit of Resolution 2000/46 of 20 April 2000 of the United Nations Commission on Human Rights that states integration be inclusive of gender issues for all agenda items facing the Commission, Deploring the current situation of women and young girls in nations such as Afghanistan as reported by the Secretary-General in his substantive report to the Commission on the Status of Women, Recalling that throughout history the human rights of women have been often and sometimes severely violated during the course of violent conflict, Appreciating the role of the Secretary-General in aiding states on the improvement of their treatment of women and their elimination of historic or present legal forms of discrimination in their societies, Deeply convinced that one of the chief goals of this council is the protection of the social rights of both men and women equally and the implementation of proper measures to ensure that equality,

Recognizing the continuing need for the gathering of information on the status of women throughout the

27 28 29	2.	Further urges the expanded efforts of non-governmental organizations to gather all appropriate data on gross violations of the fundamental human rights of women, specifically as it pertains to forms of violence during conflict;
30 31	3.	<i>Encourages</i> states to seek the education of their women populations on the nature of their human rights as women, as defined by the UN Commission on Human Rights;
32 33	4.	<i>Expresses</i> a continued desire to see the integration of the gender perspective into all agenda items facing the Economic and Social Council and all its committees;
34 35	5.	Requests that the UN and the Secretary-General continue their efforts towards the education and training of governmental leaders in the protection of women's human rights;

Urges member states to appoint more women personnel to government positions to monitor the

conflict resolution and peacekeeping processes of nations to ensure the protection of women's

6. *Expresses* sincere hope that all nations seek stricter penalties for those convicted of rape and domestic abuse and implementation of any additionally necessary legislation to promote the equality of gender in the eyes of their domestic law;

7. *Requests* the Secretary-General to review the situation of women during conflict and submit all findings in a report to the Commission on the Status of Women at its forty-sixth session;

8. *Declares accordingly* the importance of the integration of women into the economic, social, and political realms of society in each member nation.
