<i>Reaffirming</i> the importance of the effective guarantee and observance of the human rights of peoples to self-determination enshrined in the Charter of the UN and embodied in the International Covenant of Human Rights as well as in the Declaration of the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples contained in GA resolution 1514 of 14 December 1960,		
Disappointed with the continuation of colonial possessions held by member states,		
<i>Understanding</i> that Article 1 of the United Nations Charter stresses that the Organization would pursue the development of friendly relations among nations based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination,		
<i>Recognizing</i> that global conflicts caused by issues of self-determination create a need for greater understanding,		
<i>Reaffirming</i> the need to distinguish legitimate claims to self-determination from those whose concerns are not included in the following definition of self-determination,		
1. <i>Designates</i> the conditions of	self-determination as:	
a) The freedom of rea	sonable expression and of opinion,	
b) The freedom of con	nscience and of religion,	
c) The opportunity to	participate freely and fully in public life,

2. *Requests* the creation of a UN board whose purpose is defined as the review of whether groups are

The Board would provide a detailed review to the General Assembly which would engender greater legitimacy within individual states and the international community to those groups who are being denied rights to self-determination;
26 27	3.	<i>Authorizes</i> the Third Committee to establish specific membership, procedure, and meeting times and places of this board at a later time;
28 29	4.	<i>Recommends</i> that when questions on self-determination reach international proportions, bilateral negotiations between the involved states or trial before the ICJ be pursued to resolve these issues;

30 5. *Recommends* that all dialogues and negotiations concerning self determination include direct
31 representation from all parties involved
