SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Rights of Refugees **SUBMITTED TO:** The Commission on Human Rights SUBMITTED BY: Ethiopia, Kuwait, South Africa, Italy, Greece, Republic of Congo, France, Rwanda The Commission on Human Rights Acknowledging that while Internally Displaced Persons are defined, no rights are directly granted to them, Recognizing the importance of protecting the rights of refugees and those internally displaced during armed conflict and natural disasters, Bearing in mind the need to enforce and ensure the continuing care for refugees, to strengthen and expand the 1951 Geneva Convention, the 1967 Protocol, and the 2002 Global Consultations on International Protection and the resultant Programme of Action to increase protection for the internally displaced during armed conflicts and natural disasters, Calls member states to consider supporting the recommendations that were made in Ethiopia 1996 Regional Conference on Assistance to refugees, Returnees, and Displaced Persons at which issues of security were debated, *Notes* the humanitarian relief effort put forth by countries and Non-Governmental Organizations, Fully Aware of the conditions in refugee camps that are in violation of basic human rights, Alarmed by the lack of refugee care after voluntary repatriation, Noting with regret that some refugee become victims of terror laws, 1. Designates Persons Internally and Externally Displaced (PIED) to include refugees and

Internally Displaced Persons (IDP's) under a common definition, guaranteeing equal

22 23 24	2.	Calls for the expansion of the existing definition of refugees, as determined by the 1967 Convention, to include persons displaced within their homelands, due to human rights violations such as:
25 26		a. Persecution by their home government on any basis including but not limited to religious, gender, political, or ethnic discrimination,
27		b. Other violations as described by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;
28 29	3.	Recommends that the refugee burden must be a shared responsibility among the countries of origin, asylum and donor states;
30 31	4.	<i>Invites</i> all nations to fully promote and contribute to the voluntary repatriation and reintegration of refugees to their homeland;
32 33	5.	Urges all nations to ensure that legitimate PIED not considered as threat to any national security;
34 35	6.	Encourages programs to aid PIED in areas such as: education, health, sanitation, and violence;
36 37	7.	Desires the cooperation of NGO's and governments to increase international awareness of the plight of PIED.
