- *Recognizing* the 1951 Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees and the 1967 Protocol as the framework for the current refugee system,
- 3 *Acknowledging* that having the same organization to report and to protect presents a conflict of 4 interests,
- *Recalling* that protection of refugees includes, but is not limited to, providing basic needs such as
 food, shelter, clothing, water, basic safety, medical care, and sanitation as stated in the 1951
 Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees,
- *Encourages* Non-Governmental Organizations to work more closely together in order to
 better inform and share information with the United Nations High Commissioner for
 Refugees reporting body;
- 112.Invites existing non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and regional organizations to12attend a Conference on Refugee Cooperation in Accra, Ghana the first annual meeting,13the country of the conference will change annually for the purpose of discussing the14implementation of the reporting procedures. This conference would be a time for NGOs15to coordinate their efforts, establish the new reporting procedure, and make16recommendations for implementation of this system;
- 173.Endorses the establishment of a Global Network of NGO's for Refugee Rights. This18group would consist of non-partisan and privately funded NGOs, charged with the duty19of reporting on a regular and consistent basis. These NGOs should also attend the20Annual Conference on Refugee Cooperation;
- 214.*Recommends* that the NGOs at these conferences report their plan for action in the future22to the next session of the United Nations Commission of Human Rights with an outline23of their reporting procedure, a sample report, and a summary of the discussions and

24		agreem	nents made at the Conference on Refugee Cooperation;
25 26	5.	<i>Encourages</i> the United Nations Commission on Human Rights to adopt these reports as a permanent item on their agenda;	
27 28 29	6.	<i>Further recommends</i> that this body should also report back to the UNCHR with their reports as they are completed and report to all relevant countries along with a submitted report to the UNCHR and countries;	
30	7.	Emphasizes that this reporting body agenda will include:	
31 32		a.	Existence and conditions of refugee camps with respect to basic needs and human rights abuses;
33 34		b.	Political climate of both the home country and the host country in regards to a safe environment;
35 36		C.	Identify when areas of the country are designated safe for encouraged voluntary refugee repatriation;
37 38		d.	Determination of which countries are most in need of assistance, either monetary, human resource, or donations.
