- *Encourages* controls on the exports of certain biological agents, chemicals,
  manufacturing facilities and equipment not intended for pharmaceutical use and research
  that contribute to the creation and use of biological and toxin weapons;
- 19 4. *Reminds* all parties that without a universal implementation of the Biological Weapons

21 22	5.	<i>Emphasizes</i> that lethal biological weapons must not be developed, produced, stockpiled, or used by anyone under any circumstances;
