The First Committee

- 1 Recalling United Nations General Assembly Resolutions 54/54B, 55/33, and 56/24M, which
- 2 recommend action regarding both adherence to the principles of the Ottawa Convention and
- 3 general de-mining action worldwide,
- 4 *Recognizing* the entry into force of the Ottawa Convention in 1999,
- 5 Deeply Concerned by the deaths of 15,000 to 20,000 people, as well as the thousands more who are killed annually as result of anti-personnel landmines,
- Noting with regret the continued threat posed to innocent populations worldwide by the continued use of anti-personnel mines.
- 9 Recognizing the role of non-state actors in the proliferation of anti-personnel land mines, as well as the link to the illegal small arms trade;
- 11 Recognizing the right of all Member States to defense of their territory,
- 12 1. Applauds current efforts by many member states that have contributed time, training, and personnel to mine-affected areas;
- 14 2. *Encourages* all Member States who are able to do so to contribute to the efforts of mine action;
- 16 3. Further Applauds the advancement of technology in the field of mine detection and removal, and encourages the sharing of that technology between countries in the interest of humanitarian issues;

19 20	4.	Encourages member states that have not done so to sign and ratify the Ottawa Convention;
21 22	5.	Suggests that humanitarian aid be given to countries affected by anti-personnel landmines;
23 24 25	6.	Further Suggests that this aid be used both for the aid of mine victims, and also for the purposes of the education of the populations of these countries concerning anti-personnel mines;
26 27	7.	<i>Encourages</i> further aid and assistance to countries currently affected by anti-personnel mines for the purposes of de-mining;
28 29	8.	<i>Recommends</i> that Member States institute physical protection of existing stockpiles in the interest of preventing proliferation;
30 31	9.	<i>Encourages</i> Member States to contribute wherever possible to the research into more humane alternatives to the use of anti-personnel mines.
