The First Committee

- 1 Recognizing that the threat posed by biological weapons is greater than ever before,
- 2 Aware that the threat from biological weapons can come from not only countries, but terrorists
- and non-state groups,
- 4 Deeply Concerned that forty states are not parties to the Biological Weapons Conventions,
- 5 *Emphasizing* the dangerous nature of biological weapons and the absolute necessity of regulating them to ensure international peace and security,
- 7 Deeply Concerned that biological weapons can be used on non-human agents, such as crops or livestock, and the dire consequences that would ensue,
- 9 Fully Alarmed by the recent anthrax attacks upon the United States of America and the recent terror attacks around the world,
- 1. *Invites* an annual meeting of states parties to the Biological Weapons Convention beyond 2006 focusing on the implementation of Review Conference commitments, encouraging universality and working to preserve the vitality of the BWC;
- 14 2. *Calls Upon* all nations to have full-fledged participation, thus making the Convention universal;
- 16 3. *Encourages* controls on the exports of certain biological agents, chemicals,
 17 manufacturing facilities and equipment not intended for pharmaceutical use and research
 18 that contribute to the creation and use of biological and toxin weapons;
- 19 4. Reminds all parties that without a universal implementation of the Biological Weapons

20		Convention, the full impact of regulations will not be felt;
21 22	5.	<i>Emphasizes</i> that lethal biological weapons must not be developed, produced, stockpiled, or used by anyone under any circumstances;
23 24 25	6.	Deplores any states which have undertaken biological weapons research, production, development or stockpiling except with the intent of researching or creating antidotes, vaccines, and other bio-defense measures;
26 27	7.	<i>Requests</i> the prevention of the transfer of information and knowledge pertaining to the creation of biological or toxin weapons;
28 29	8.	<i>Emphasizes</i> the importance of Confidence Building Measures (CBM's) to make the use of Biological and Toxin Weapons more transparent;
30 31	9.	<i>Urges</i> that each state establishes a National Consultive Group which provides a forum for discussion with groups affected by the Biological Weapons Convention Protocol;
32	10.	Encourages the sharing of bio-defense measures and information under Article X;
33 34	11.	<i>Requests</i> that biological and toxin weapons used on non-human agents be treated the same as those on humans, a deplorable offense;
35 36	12.	<i>Recommends</i> that states work in conjunction with the World Health Organization to decrease biological and toxin weapons potency.
