- 1 Recognizing the extremely volatile situation in the Middle East,
- 2 Deeply concerned that this situation will continue to escalate,
- 3 Noting alliances among many member states with the nations involved in this conflict,
- 4 *Reminding* all members of the United Nations that they are here in the interest of international peace and security,
- 6 Fully believing this conflict can be solved through this diplomatic body without the use of force,
- 7 1. *Calls upon* the nations involved to agree to an immediate cease-fire effective May 26, 1967 in the Middle East;
- 9 2. Requests the complete withdrawal of all troops in the area to the internationally accepted borders of their nation;
- Recommends the extension of the demilitarization zone of an area twenty kilometers in the Sinai Peninsula, ten kilometers on the Israeli side of the border and ten kilometers on the Egyptian side of the border for ninety days in order to facilitate peace agreement between the parties involved;
 - 4. *Reminds* nations involved in the conflict to adhere to the cease-fire in place in the Golan;
- 16 5. *Reestablishes* the presence of UN observers in the demilitarization zones in the Middle East;
- 18 6. *Reminds* all member states of the UN objective of obtaining peace through diplomatic means;

- 7. *Reminds* all members involved in this conflict of the pre-existing Armistice Agreement;
- 8. *Encourages* all members to abide by this agreement;
- 22 9. *Remains* actively seized of this matter.
