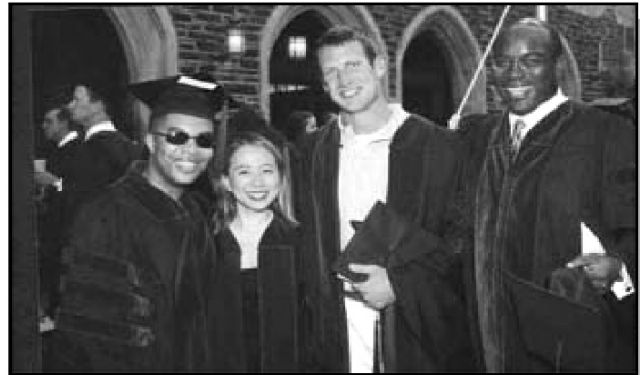
*Michael Byers*

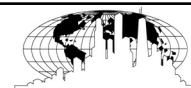

2003 AMUN Conference will be held on Monday, 25 November 2002.*

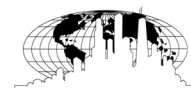

During the 2003-2004 academic year, a year-long 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary program will celebrate the legacy of Dr. Ralph J. Bunche, a great American and a great international civil servant.

From humble beginnings as a young black man in America, he achieved many firsts in a racially hostile social environment. He fashioned several path-breaking careers, in academia, as a civil rights leader and as a dedicated civil servant in both the United States government and the United Nations. He was to be the first African-American, or person of color of any origin to be awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace.

The Centenary Commemoration Committee wishes to "translate the legend, which is an instrument for a better future for humanity". It has identified themes that can serve as a focus of an activity: The Scholar-Activist; Civil Rights and Race: An American Dilemma Revisited; The Integrity of Public Service, International and National; Self-Determination and Decolonization; Mediation, Negotiation and Peacekeeping; A New Generation Looks at Ralph J. Bunche: Africa; The Arab-Israeli Conflict The United States and Africa.

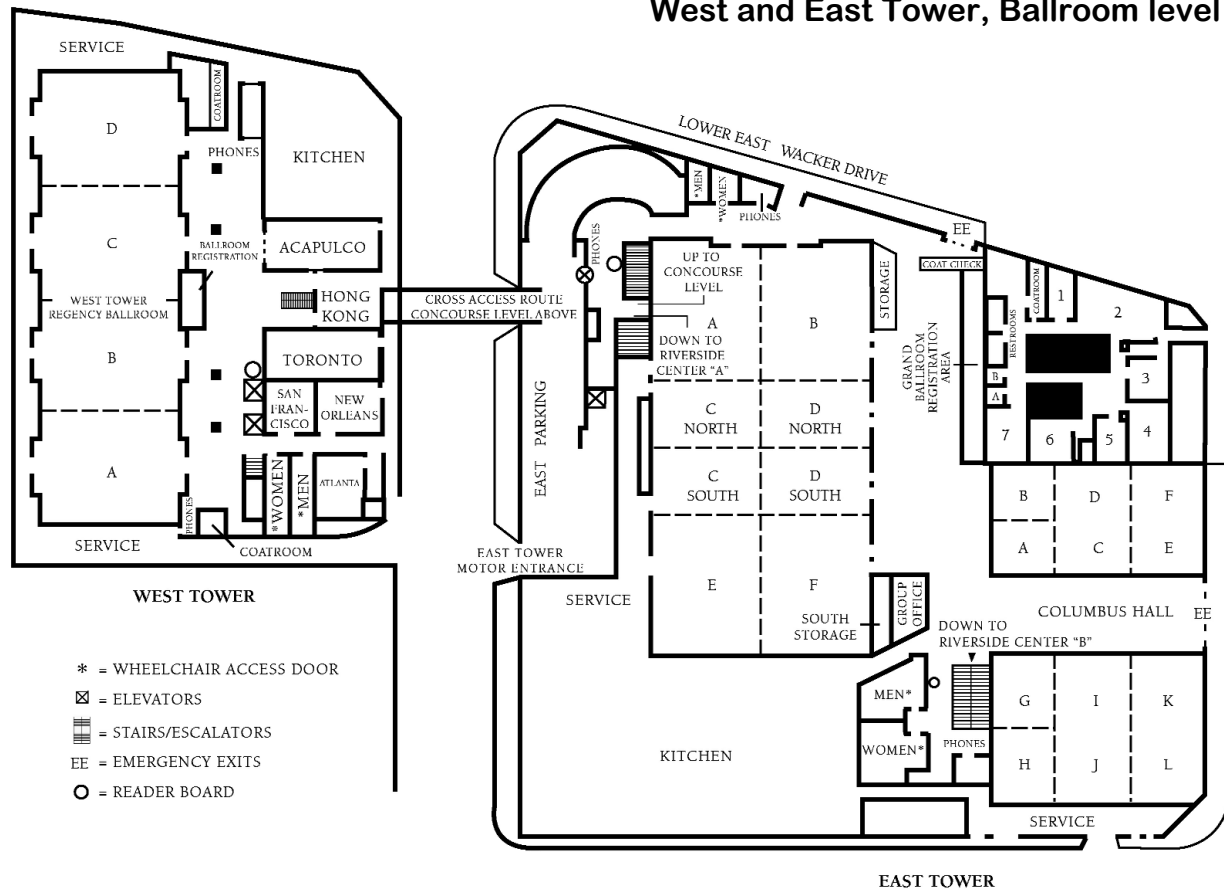

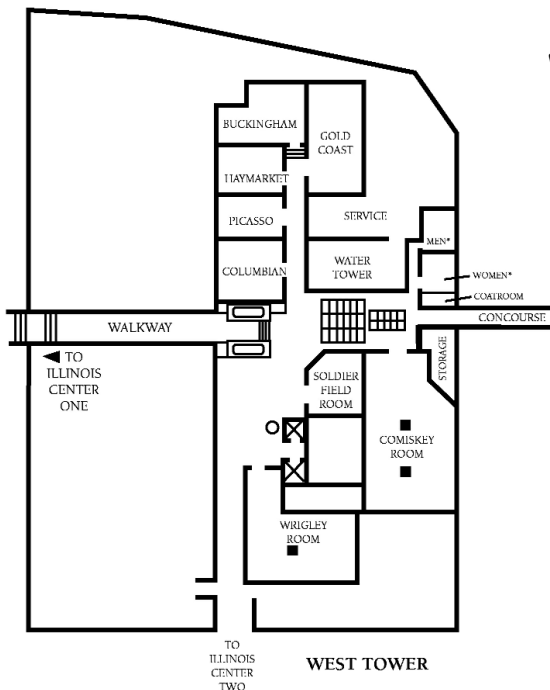

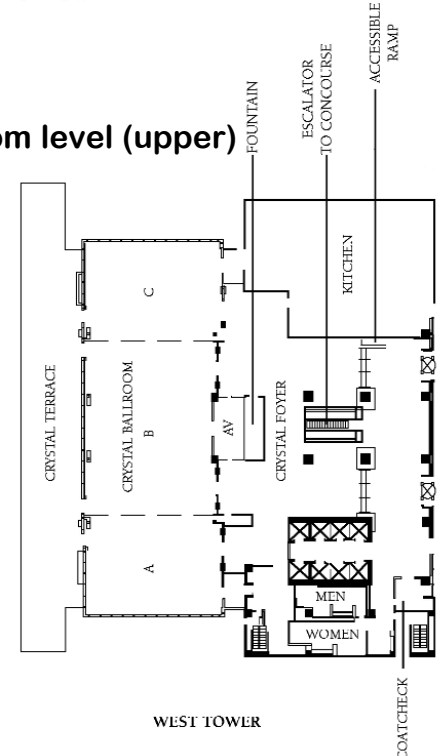
## West and East Tower, Ballroom level (lower)

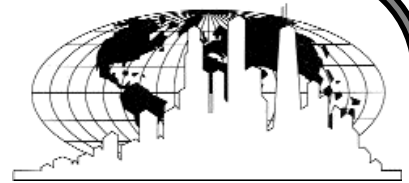
