Humanitarian Affairs: Special Economic, Humanitarian and SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Disaster Relief Assistance SUBMITTED TO: The Economic and Social Council SUBMITTED BY: Ghana The Economic and Social Council *Noting with deep concern* the resurgence of polio outbreaks in countries that have already been declared polio free, Realizing that polio is a devastating disease that primarily affects children, frequently leaving them crippled or dead, Confident that polio can be eradicated from the world with well-planned, well-managed programs and sufficient aid, *Understanding* that an effective strategy to eliminate world disease has already been developed, implemented, and been successful in the campaign against small pox, Recognizing that as long as polio exists, the citizens of all Member States are at risk from polio outbreaks, 1. Applauds current action by the World Health Organization for the formation of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative and its progress in eliminating this disease from the world; 2. Affirms the need to develop a more effective program to prevent re-infection in countries declared clear of polio; 3. Declares accordingly that measures which have proven effective for eradicating other

5. Further requests that WHO provide a program of surveillance and containment based on the program used to eradicate small pox be developed along the following guidelines:

diseases such as smallpox should be employed once again in order to eliminate polio from the world;

had polio infections within the last year with the approval of these Member States and individual

4. Recommends the WHO implement a program of mass vaccination in Member States that have

22	(a) Neighborhood water-testing for the disease in infected communities;
23 24	(b) Treatment of all cases with symptoms of the disease as polio, with consent of the patient, until proven otherwise;
25	(c) Vaccination of every community within a 16-kilometer radius of an infection;
26	(d) Posting of United Nations medical officers to live in at risk communities;
27 28	(e) Creation of a list of villages at high risk for future outbreak and monitor them closely for four to six weeks;
29	(f) Receive regular feedback from field workers at all levels;
30	6. <i>Encourages</i> the training of fieldworkers as follows:
31 32 33	(a) Workers undergo United Nations training simulation in which the workers must trace the source of an outbreak, locate all people who came in contact with infected persons when contagious, and carry out the aforementioned containment operations;
34 35	(b) Volunteer trainees play the role of chief of state, watch against infection from neighboring areas, investigate sources of infection, and decipher confusing or conflicting reports;
36 37	7. Calls on UNICEF, and WHO to provide adequate funding as in past disease control programs to ensure the timely containment and elimination of this disease;
38 39	8. <i>Proclaims</i> that the world does not need to endure the paralysis and death of its children due to polio.
