SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Sustainable Development and International Economic Cooperation: Integration of the Economies in Transition into the World Economy

The General Assembly

1 *Believing* that international efforts to promote sustainable development and the integration of all
2 economies into the world markets have met with unsatisfactory measures of success,

3 *Reaffirming* the responsibility of all nations to promote the integration of economies in transition
4 into the world economy,

5 *Seeking* to illuminate the need for a greater understanding of multifarious areas including but not
6 limited to: investment, economic competition, environmental protection, governmental procurement,
7 technical knowledge and ability, resource capacity, and the necessity for the willingness of developing
8 countries to negotiate on each of these issues,

9 *Emphasizing* that the development of infrastructure is crucial to accomplishing the goal of
10 sustainable development as well as the integration of all economies into the global market,

11 1. *Emphasizes* the need to integrate the economies of less developed nations and those in
12 transition into the global market at an incremental rate;

13 2. *Reaffirms* that aid policies should be focused on the creation of infrastructure to give
14 developing nations and economies in transition the best possible opportunity to succeed;

15 3. *Calls* for a written contractual agreement between aid donors and aid recipients to be created
16 on a case by case basis and evaluated accordingly, and administered throughout the UNDP as a means
17 of guaranteeing;

18 (a) the reliability of aid donation to LDCs by donor nations on a regular basis and;

19 (b) the accountability to donor nations that fund usage be appropriately used to further the goals
20 of global economic integration;

21 4. *Further requests* that developed nations consider a reduction of tariffs on less developed
22 nations and economies in transition as a substitutive form of aid for those nations in need who commit
23 to the UNDP aid agreement.
