Noting with deep concern the continued struggle to protect victims of armed conflict throughout the world,

Emphasizing the importance of the Protocols Additional to the Geneva Convention of 1949 and relating to the protection of victims of armed conflict,

Bearing in mind Article 1 of the Charter of the United Nations; respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination of peoples of all member states,

Reaffirming Article 3 of the Protocols Additional to the Geneva Convention of 1949 that assures the sovereignty of states,

Noting with alarm the shift in conflict from declared war to armed conflict,

- 1. Welcomes able member states to provide domestic aid and/or other non-military forms of assistance to member states in conflict in order to ensure the protection of non-combatants provided by the Geneva Accords, subject to the request of the member state in conflict;
- 2. *Recomends* the formation of a commission to reevaluate the Geneva Convention and Protocols Additional in relation to armed conflict;
- 3. *Reminds* member states of the importance of states sovereignty in determining how to appropriately protect civilians during both declared war and armed conflict within individual member states:
- 4. *Strongly condemns* the actions of rebellious groups in violation of the Geneva Convention with the understanding of states right to self-determination;

20 21	5. <i>Encourages</i> the commission to consider the effects that groups hostile to international peace and security have on member states;
22 23	6. <i>Calls upon</i> the commission to submit their findings to the Secretary-General by January 1, 2005;
24 25 26	7. <i>Encourages</i> nations states to accept the assistance of the International Committee of the Red Cross and other relevant non-governmental organizations (NGOs), during and especially after an armed conflict.
