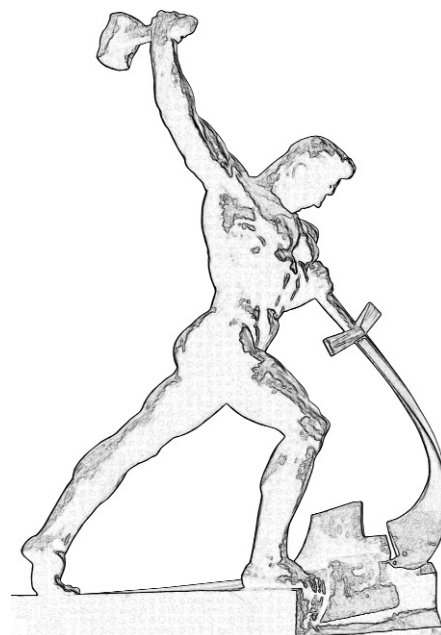

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

RAMU DAMODARAN

Chief of the Civil Society Service in the United Nations Department of Public Information



Ramu Damodaran is the Chief of the Civil Society Service in the United Nations Department of Public Information (since February 2003), having previously served as the Officer-in-Charge of the Service (November 2002 to January 2003.) The Service integrates outreach to the non-governmental, educational and private sector constituencies, as well as to

the general public. Its programmes include briefings to NGOs, schools, universities and visiting groups, publication of the *UN Chronicle* magazine in its print and online editions, commemoration of special observances, the holding of special events, and a training programme for broadcasters and journalists from developing countries. Prior to this assignment, Mr. Damodaran was the Editor-in-Chief of the *UN Chronicle* (since April 1996), a title that he holds concurrently.

He previously served at the UN as the Senior Officer in the Executive Office of the Secretary-General (July 1995 to July 1996), where he was primarily responsible for preparing drafts of the statements, lectures, articles, messages and correspondence of the Secretary-General. He also coordinated with other departments, offices and agencies in the UN system to ensure the reflection of their priorities and

concerns. Prior to that assignment, he served as the Senior Focal Point and Liaison Officer in the UN Department of Peacekeeping Operations (June 1994 to June 1995.) In an earlier term at the UN, Mr. Damodaran served as a Political Affairs Officer in the Department of Special Political Operations (August 1989 to July 1991), with special responsibilities for Namibia and Western Sahara. During that time, he also served as the Secretary of the UN Mission to Kuwait (March to May 1991), assessing the damage to Kuwait's infrastructure and economy after Iraq's occupation.

Mr. Damodaran came to the UN following a distinguished career in the government and foreign service of his native India. He was most recently the Private Secretary and Executive Assistant to the Prime Minister of India (1 August 1991 to 31 May 1994.) His responsibilities there included the management of the front office of the Prime Minister, drafting of speeches, statements and correspondence, and special responsibility for overseeing preparation of Cabinet papers and parliamentary statements. Prior to this assignment, he served as the First Secretary (Political) in the Permanent Mission of India to the United Nations (April 1986 to June 1989). Among other prior posts, he also served his government as the Second Secretary to the Embassy of India in Moscow (October 1980 to April 1982.)

Before entering government service, Mr. Damodaran was a freelance journalist and radio and television producer between 1972 and 1986.

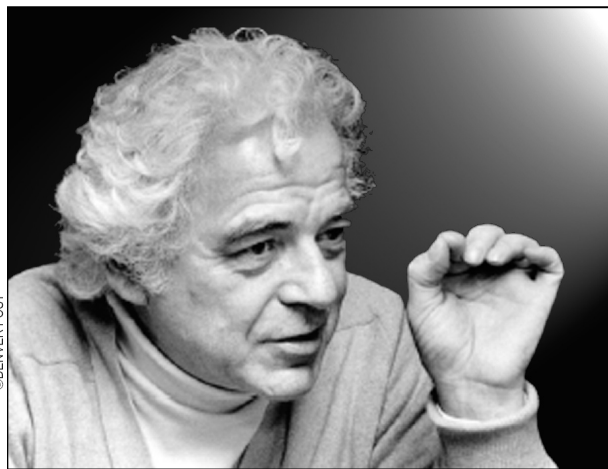

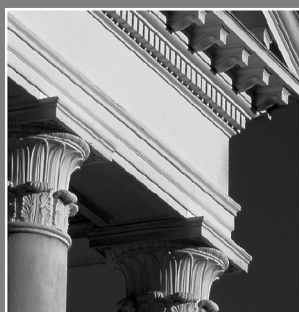

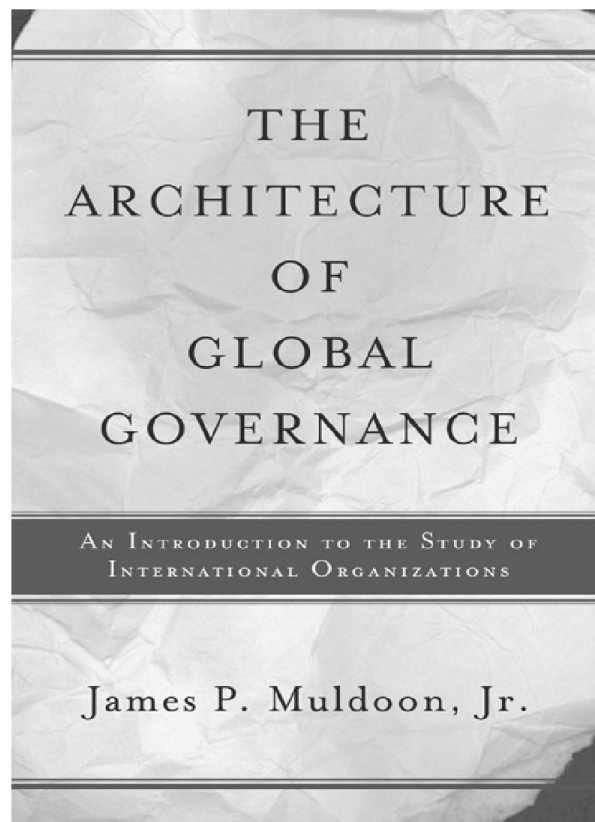

He has contributed to major newspapers and academic journals on contemporary international affairs, and is co-editor of *Multilateral Diplomacy and the United Nations Today* (Westview Press, 1999). He resides in Lake Forest, Illinois.

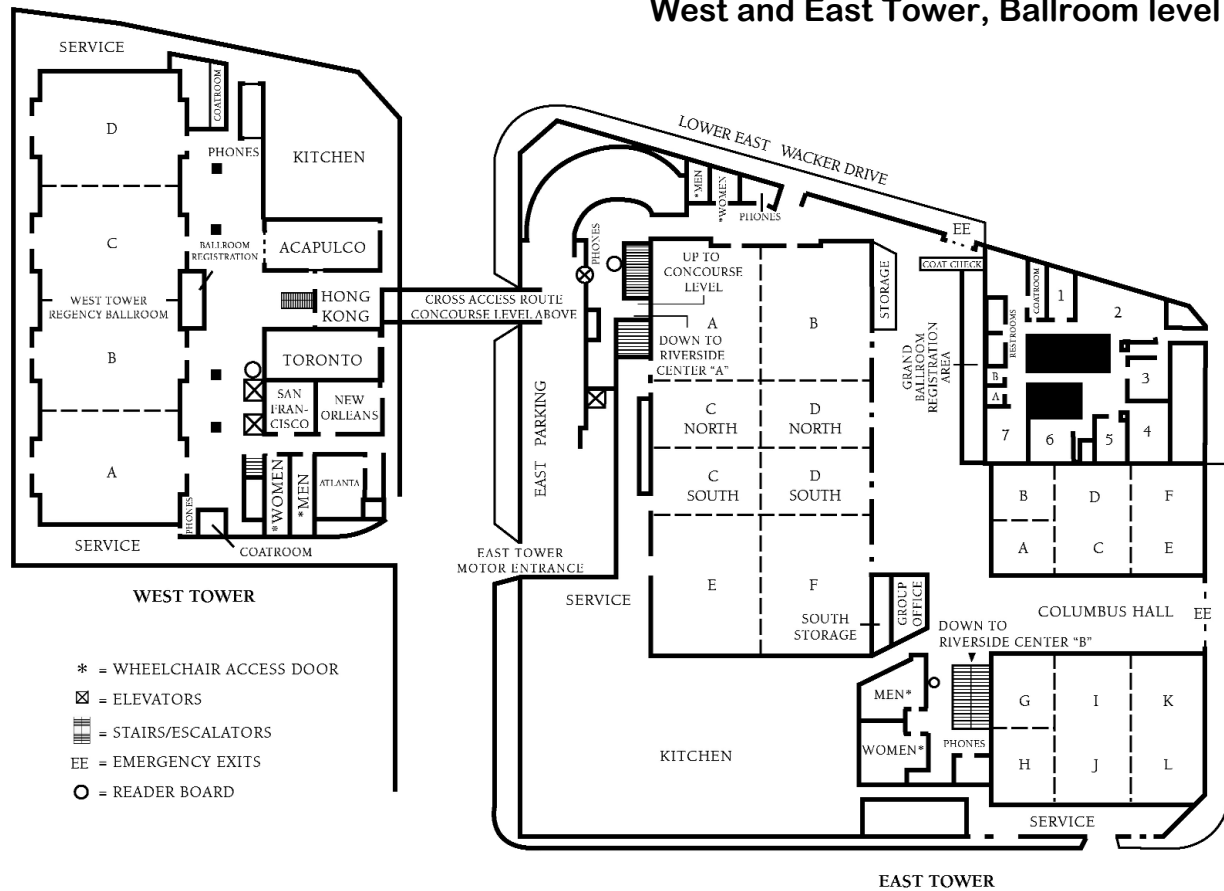

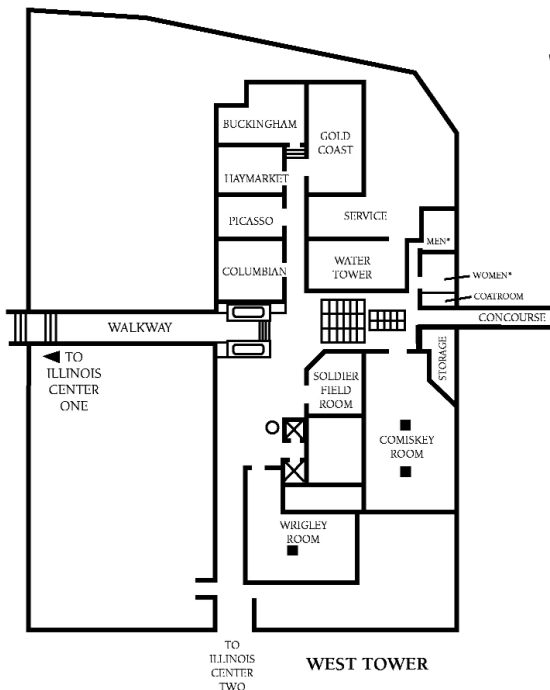

HYATT REGENCY CHICAGO CONFERENCE CENTER MAPS

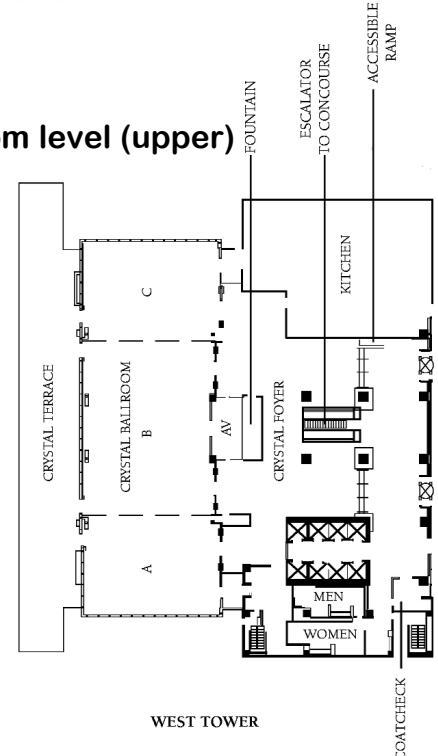
West and East Tower, Ballroom level (lower)

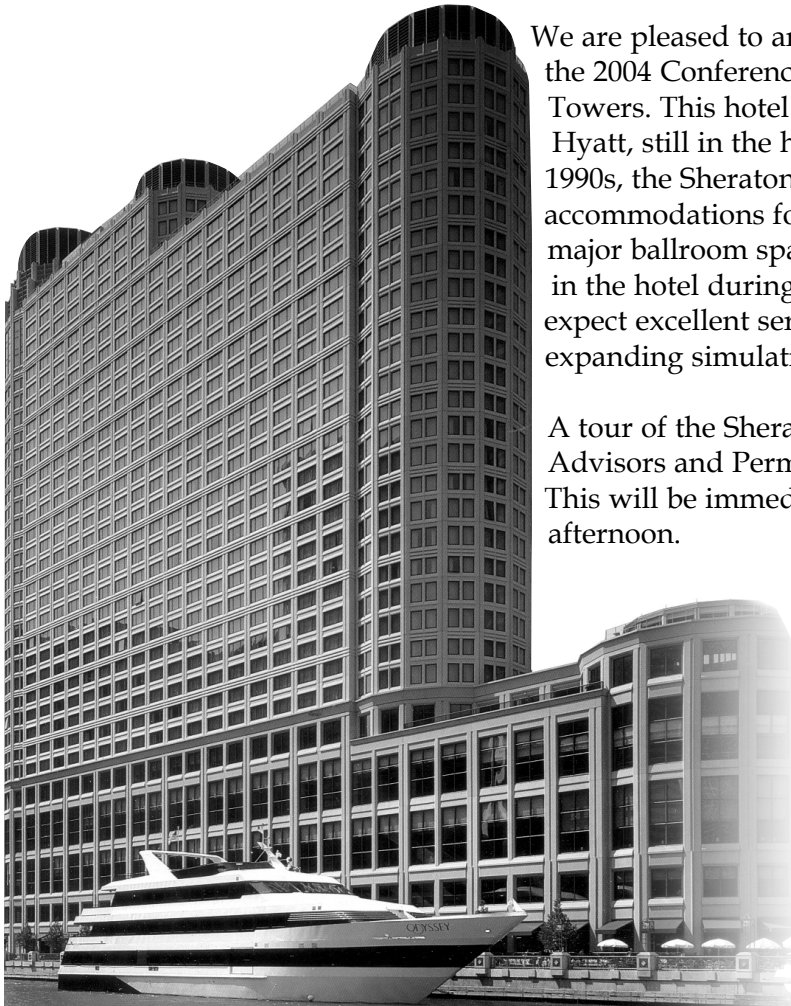
Beginning with the 2004 Conference, AMUN will be increasing the number of simulations we provide and moving to a new conference facility.

TWO NEW SIMULATIONS ADDED IN 2004!

With the continuing growth of the AMUN Conference, we are adding two new simulations in 2004 to provide both a broader range of the topics on the UN's agenda, as well as an excellent additional opportunity for more students from your school to participate in AMUN. The simulations are:

1. A concurrent General Assembly (GA) Plenary session. The GA Plenary will meet during all four days of the Conference, with every delegation assigned to this simulation. THE BRANDT EQUATION: AN IDEA WHOSE TIME HAS COME...

“A new century nears, and with it the prospects of a new civilization. Could we not begin to lay the basis for that new community with reasonable relations among all people and nations, and to build a world in which sharing, justice, freedom and peace might prevail?”

—Willy Brandt, 1983

Dear Model UN Delegates,

We are writing to alert you to the existence of a plan which, if implemented, would go a long way toward correcting the injustices and imbalances in the global economy that lie behind today's major world crises. That plan is summarized in the report, *The Brandt Equation: 21st Century Blueprint for the New Global Economy*, described in the following paragraphs.

To put the report in context, twenty years ago the Independent Commission on International Development Issues proposed a sweeping series of measures to address the economic problems in the developing world, which, it believed, would eventually engulf the developed world as well. Willy Brandt's panel of former world leaders called for a full-scale restructuring of the global economy, along with a comprehensive new approach to the problems of development.












The Brandt Equation reintroduces and updates the Brandt Commission's vision for a sustainable global economy. It stresses that the welfare of global society must be given greater weight than that of any individual, group, or nation, and identifies the missing elements in the current management of the world economy. It calls on world leaders to share responsibility and cooperate to fulfill common needs, ensure the right of personal livelihood, improve living standards, and thus guarantee the well-being of global society.

The Brandt Equation calls for a full-scale reordering of global priorities to meet humanity's interrelated economic problems and development needs. It is a blueprint for the twenty-first century economy, a definite course of action to renew the foundations of money and commerce, allowing global economic policies, structures, and systems to serve the public interest rather than the interests of corporate globalization.

We ask you to take a fresh look at the Brandt proposals. You may be surprised at how prescient Brandt's 'program for survival' was in 1980, and how practical it is today. You may read *The Brandt Equation* at our web site, www.Brandt21Forum.info, and download a copy in pdf format.

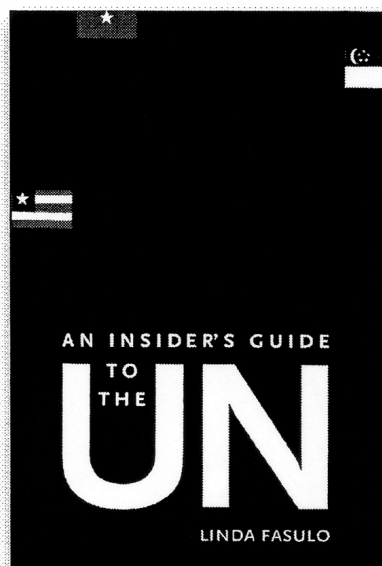

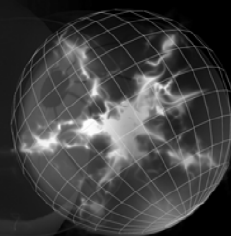

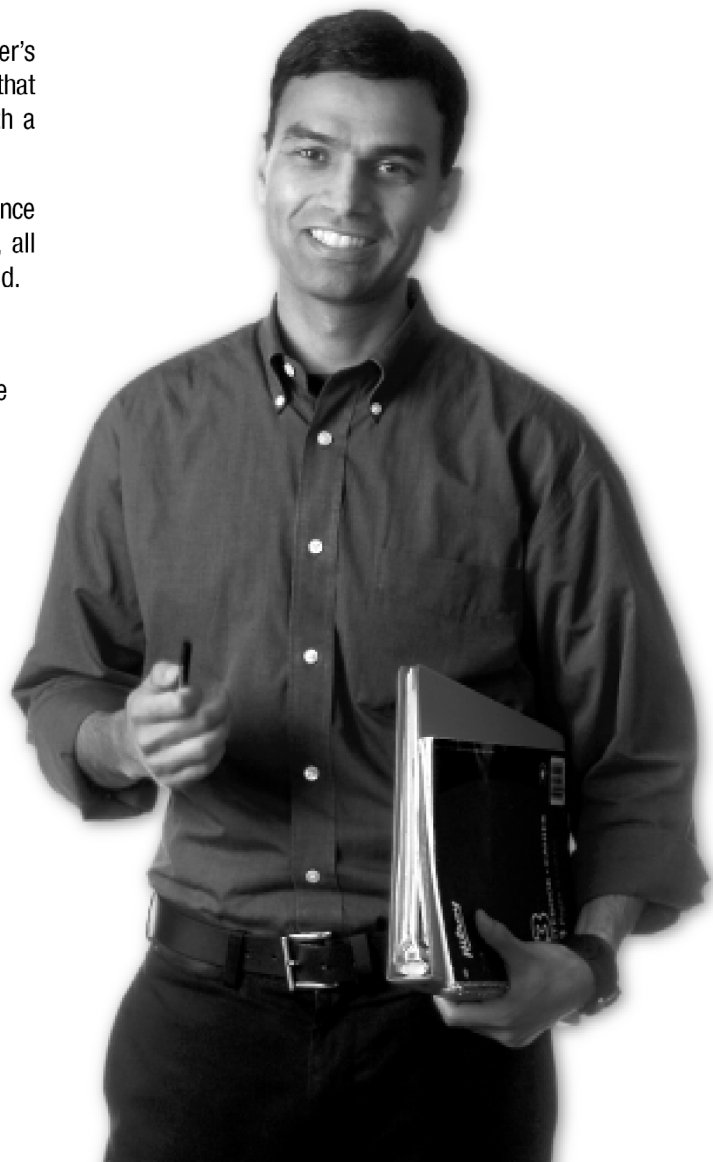
