Situation in Afghanistan

Reaffirming its previous resolutions on Afghanistan, in particular resolutions 1386 (2001), 1413 (2002), 1444 (2002), 1471 (2003) and 1510 (2003),	
Recognizing the current security threats to the UN forces in Afghanistan,	

1. *Urges* the member states to increase humanitarian aid to Afghanistan directly correlating with the security stabilization;

Noting Afghanistan's expressed desires to the UN Security Council to continue humanitarian aid

Recognizing that Afghanistan only received half of its promised aid since 2002,

- 2. *Demands* the upholding Afghanistan s national sovereignty by supporting the Afghan Transitional Authority with the goal of transferring full responsibility for the country s security to the Authority when the Afghani government, in consultation with the UN Security Council, determines that a sustainable level of economic and military stability has been achieved;
- 3. *Calls upon* all able UN member states to provide the military and financial resources needed for the International Security Assistance Force to fulfill its mandate as expanded in resol ution 1510, in particular the protection of UN and other aid personnel, with a goal of a security situation in which UN and other international aid programs can recommence operations by 1 January, 2004;
 - 4. Draws attention to the importance for humanitarian efforts to focus on the refugee situation;
- 5. *Encourages* multi-lateral constabulary forces to assist in training the Afghani police and military forces already in training by the United States in an effort to increase the legitimacy of the Afghani government;
- 6. *Recognizing* the need for the Afghan Transitional Authority to establish a presence and control in the cities outside of Kabul;

8. *Urges* neighboring countries to continue to share the burden of hosting refugees in conjunction with UN humanitarian efforts and requests the Secretary General to direct aid workers to those areas to help deal with the needs of those refugees;

7. Calls upon neighboring countries to continue to monitor and control borders;

- 9. Calls upon all UN member states to participate in an international donors conference to secure financial assistance to both the humanitarian efforts in Afghanistan and the Transitional Autority in Afghanistan with a special focus upon a. giving assistance to refugees, b. providing for the disarmament of irregular forces, through programs which provide job training and opportunities for participants, c. reconstruction efforts of Afghanistan;
 - 10. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
