Making Trade and Environment Mutually Supportive

Welcoming multilateral approaches between private and civil sectors to contend with the trade deficits, poverty eradication, and environmental initiatives,

Believing free market benefits will alleviate the necessity of environmental degradation and that the environment offers potential opportunities, thus promoting preservation,

Emphasizing the importance of coordinating objectives and policies on national, regional, and international levels, with special attention to preserving natural resources,

Deeply concerned that unsound environmental practices have indelibly impacted future generations' ability to sustain development,

1. *Endorses* working through regional and international bodies that will report annually to CSD to determine effective policy coordination in accord with Agenda 21, the Rio Declaration and Millennium Declaration;

2. *Requests* that the international community increases transfer of technology, opens international trade markets and stimulates investment in human and physical capital;

3. Encourages expanded participation in multilateral free and fair trade zones;

4. *Emphasizes* the necessity for sustainable development through trade liberalization, while promoting state sovereignty, environmental protections, and reconsidering economically detrimental sanctions;

5. *Further encourages* the reduction of export subsidies in accordance with the Doha Ministerial Declaration.
