



Discover Your Place in the World



Following Ezra Weinberg's graduation from Hampshire College with a major in conflict transformation, he went to Israel to put into practice what he had learned in theory about peacebuilding. Soon after he got to Jerusalem, he said, "initiatives I had heard about – these great success stories of Israelis and Palestinians getting together – were disintegrating. The region was, before my eyes, moving from a post-conflict zone to a conflict zone."

Seeking to enhance his knowledge of the field, Ezra enrolled in SIT's CONTACT: Conflict Transformation Across Cultures program. "I got support from the faculty, and I was able to be in touch online with peacebuilders around the world – anywhere there was conflict." The next year, he entered SIT's Programs in Intercultural Service, Leadership, and Management to earn a Master of Arts in Conflict Transformation.

SIT's experience-based educational model suited Ezra's learning style. "SIT asks you to internalize experiences and reflect on them. It asks you to challenge yourself and use that experience to challenge the world."

Ezra's experiences in Israel as a post-graduate and during his SIT internship with the Palestine-Israel Journal, convinced him that his future lay in applying his peacebuilding and conflict transformation skills from a religious perspective. He is currently studying to be a rabbi.





UNCERTAIN SOIL: THE STORY OF UNITED NATIONS PEACEKEEPING

This one hour and 45 minute documentary film covers the history of the creation of peacekeeping and follows its evolution through the end of the Cold War. At that time, a new era of peacekeeping witnessed several early successes as the Cold War began to thaw; then a series of drastic failures overtook events.
