SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: High-Level Segment: Promoting and Integration Approach to Rural Development in Developing Countries for Poverty Education and Sustainable Development

SUBMITTED TO: Economic and Social Council

Economic and Social Council,

Believing the participation of multilateral commitment is important to the Millennium goals of the United Nations and the Brussels Declaration,

Recognizing the goals set by the United Nations Conference on Least Developed Countries and that the Brussels Program of Action was created to make progress toward the global goals of poverty eradication, peace, and development,

Recognizing the importance of agricultural exports to developing countries,

Understanding that Developing Countries should not become entirely dependent upon international trade for their sustainable development, while *believing* that the improvement of international trade will bring new technologies and ideas to Developing Countries, thus stimulating and expanding these economies,

Acknowledging that the limits of internal markets can hinder economic growth by restricting the size of consumer market,

Believing in the importance of increasing levels of trade between developing and developed countries under the importance of developing and encouraging new consumer markets,

Acknowledging the importance of diversification for stabilizing economic growth in developing countries,

Recognizing the importance of opening markets to the global economy especially for mono-crop export based economies,

1. *Calls upon* all nations to move toward internal sustainable development through educational reform, national policy initiatives, and an increasing interdependent global system of trade in international markets;

2. *Requests* that the Committee of Sustainable Development explores and analyzes:

(a) the effect of subsidies on foreign trade;
