SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Rwanda

1 *The Historical Security Council*

2  
3 *Taking note* of the interim report of the Secretary-General regarding the situation  
4 in Rwanda,

5  
6 *Also taking note* of the letters of the Permanent Representative of Rwanda  
7 (S/25355) and the Permanent Representative of Uganda (S/25356) dated 22 February  
8 1993 in which the Government of both these countries called for the deployment of the  
9 United Nations observers along their common border,

10  
11 *Gravely concerned* by the fighting in Rwanda and its consequences regarding  
12 international peace and security,

13  
14 *Alarmed* by the humanitarian consequences of the increasing number of refugees  
15 and displaced persons,

16  
17 *Fully alarmed* by the breakdown in peace talks between parties of the conflict,

18  
19 *Paying tribute* to the efforts of the Organization of African Unity (OAU) in order  
20 to promote a negotiated political solution,

21  
22 *Taking into consideration* the burdens placed on the resources of neighboring  
23 countries by the influx of refugees,

24  
25 *Stressing* the need for demilitarized safe zones and the maintenance of a cease-  
26 fire by all parties within Rwanda,

27  
28 *Deeply disturbed* by any group provoking or instigating violence and instability in  
29 Rwanda,

30  
31 *Further stressing* the need for protection of observers and other UN personnel  
32 involved in these processes,

33  
34 1. *Authorizes* an observer mission to Uganda-Rwanda to be placed under the  
35 command of the United Nations and under the authority of the Security Council as per  
36 the direction of the Secretary General for an initial period of six months;

- 37                   2. *Further authorizes* the United Nations Observer Mission to Uganda-Rwanda  
38 (UNOMUR) to monitor the border between Uganda and Rwanda on the side of Uganda;

- 40                   3. *Requests* 162 military observers, 34 international and 14 local civilian support  
41 staff to be provided by Member States at the request of the Secretary-General in order to  
42 carry out the monitoring and verification activities;

- 44                   4. *Recommends* the Secretary-General develop contingency provisions for the  
45 immediate evacuation of UN personnel in order to ensure their safety, should the  
46 situation in Rwanda further deteriorate;  
47
- 48                   5. *Further Recommends* that the involved personnel be equally selected from the  
49 different geographical regions of the world;

- 51                   6. *Encourages* Member States to fulfill the security needs of the observers for this  
52 mission;

- 54                   7. *Further Encourages* Member States to contribute financial assistance and  
55 peacekeeping troops with the goal of 2000 peacekeepers to be immediately deployed in  
56 Rwanda;

- 58                   8. *Requests* that the Secretary-General present a report to the Security Council on  
59 this matter at the end of the initial period of six months;  
60
- 61                   9. *Calls upon* all Member States and non-governmental resolutions to  
62 immediately provide all necessary humanitarian aid;

- 64                   10. *Requests* increased humanitarian aid to areas affected by a great number of  
65 refugees and displaced persons;

- 67                   11. *Urgently requests* that the International Committee of the Red Cross be sent  
68 to Rwanda to investigate and monitor the situation in Rwanda;

- 70                   12. *Decides* to remain seized of the matter.
