REGARDING: The Situation in Somalia

SUBMITTED TO: Historic Security Council

Noting with concern the tremendous complexity of the situation in Somalia, the political unrest and the absence of both international and domestic law,

Regretting the ongoing violence in Somalia and the threat it poses to the reconciliation process,

Deeply deploring the attacks aimed at UN personnel, specifically the incidents of 13 July 1993 and 23 July 1993 against the troops of Pakistan and Morocco,

Affirming the role of UN personnel in the important task of distributing and protecting humanitarian aid in Somalia,

Stressing that protection is required by all UN personnel in Somalia and is absolutely crucial in accomplishing their humanitarian goals,

Reaffirming Security Council resolution 733 (1992) of 23 June 1992, 746 (1992) of 17 March 1992, 751 (1992) of 24 April 1992, 767 (1992) of 27 July 1992, 775 (1992) of 28 August 1992 and 794 (1992) of 03 December 1992,

Bearing in mind General Assembly resolution 47/167 of 18 December 1992,

Realizing that the changing circumstances warrants an expansion in the mandate of UNOSOM II,

- 1. Strongly condemns all attacks by all responsible parties on United Nations personnel;
- 2. Further condemns the actions of Somali National Army (SNA) leadership with regard to the attacks on Moroccan military units under the leadership of the United Nations, on 23 July 1993;
 - 3. Offers condolences to the families and Member States of those killed in these attacks;
- 4. *Emphasizes* the absolute necessity of humanitarian aid in accordance with the UN Charter and the spirit of the United Nations in reaching a successful resolution to the conflict in Somalia;

- 5. *Reaffirms* the commitment to a negotiated peace with the ultimate end of Somalis resuming the national political process;
- 6. Reaffirms operative clause 3 of Security Council resolution 814 (1993) calling for a renewed effort to peace talks in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia among all parties and factions;
- 7. Suggests the division of UNOSOM II into two key elements one focused on humanitarian aid and its effective distribution in Mogadishu the other focused upon the effective distribution of humanitarian aid in all other regions of Somalia;
- 8. Requests the Secretary General oversee the implementation of the newly redefined UNOSOM II forces (operative clause 7) with regard to their logistical requirements in relation to their regional considerations,
- (a) To assist the United Nations Operation in Somalia II: Mogadishu (UNOSOM II MOG) concerning the protection of humanitarian aid and the distributing forces under the direction of the United States of America,
- (b) To assist the United Nations Operation in Somalia II: Regional Areas (UNOSOM II REGA) concerning the swift and proper distribution of humanitarian aid;
- 9. Authorizes Member Nations contributing troops to UNOSOM II missions to provide their own security, provided it reflects the revised mandate, Chapter VII of the United Nations Charter and the humanitarian purpose of the mission;
- 10. *Strongly encourages* member states to willingly contribute troops and financial support to the newly expanded mission;
- 11. *Requests* that the Secretary-General make a report to the Security Council as to the state and effectiveness of these revisions within thirty days time;
 - 12. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
