18 19 20	<i>Welcoming</i> the offering of President Mbeki of South Africa to mediate the conflict within Cote d'Ivoire,

30 31 32	1. <i>Expresses</i> its hope that a pe	eaceful solution to the situation can be found;	
33	2. Calls upon the Ivorian Gov	vernment and the Forces Nouvelles to honor the previous

36	3. Invites the African Union to set up new peace talks expanding on the current peace	
37	treaty and if necessary produce a more agreeable compromise;	
38	dealy and it necessary produce a more agreediste compromise;	
39	4. Encourages the African Union to work towards disarmament of both the Government	
40	and Rebel forces within the conflict zone;

42	5. Decides to increase the number of UN Peacekeepers within the region for a period	
43	lasting until after elections have taken place and stability has been established;

45	6. Decides to, in coordination with the African Union, set up, facilitate, and supply refugee	
46	camps outside of Cote d'Ivoire to ensure the health and safety of the refugees until they are able	
47	to return to their homes;

49	7. Invites member states to pledge economic resources for the upkeep of peace keeping	
50	forces and refugee camps;	
51		
52	8. Invites Sierra Leone and Benin to tolerate the influx of refugees into their countries and	
53	offer their assistance in protecting the refugees due to the troubling humanitarian situation in	
54	Liberia;

56	9. Decides that limited economic aid will be given to those countries willing to allow	
57	refugee camps and actively ensure the health and safety of the refugees;	
58		
59	10. Declares that actions such as sanctions, although unfortunate, will continue to be	
60	enforced as long as hostilities continue;	
61		
62	11. Encourages the restoration of the international community within Cote d'Ivoire such	
63	as the re-establishment of the economic sector as well as humanitarian aid sector;	
64		
65	12. Condemns any hostile and offensive military action by any groups within Cote d'Ivoire	
66	seeing that previous military involvements have resulted in the deaths of members of the	
67	peacekeeping force currently within the area;	
68		
69	13. Calls upon Benin, Spain, China, U.K., Brazil, Philippines, and Chile to cumulatively	
70	send at least 4,000 troops to Cote D'Ivoire to serve as peacekeeping foreces in place of	
71	withdrawing French troops;	
72		
73	14. <i>Decides</i> to remain actively seized of the matter.
