The Commission on the Status of Women

- 1 *Having studied* the state of women's sexual and reproductive health around the
2 world,
3
4 *Understanding* that Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) exists as a worldwide
5 cultural practice but nonetheless violates the Universal Declaration of Human Rights as
6 well as the Beijing Platform for Action,
7
8 *Considers* the work that has already been done on this issue,
9
10 *Recognizing* that the practice of FGM often results in irreparable medical damage
11 to women's bodies and/or death,
12
13 *Noting with concern* that maternal mortality rates are problematic in all member
14 states, regardless of development status,
15
16 *Regretting* the spread of the HIV/AIDS pandemic as a result of erroneous beliefs
17 about the transmission and treatment of the disease,
18
19 *Emphasizing* that the education of men and boys plays an integral role in
20 eliminating these practices that are detrimental to the sexual reproductive health of
21 women worldwide,
22
23 1. *Seeks* to increase the awareness of the harmful effects of FGM, including the
24 physical, emotional, and psychological damage that occurs:
25
26 (a) Calls upon member states to cooperate with NGOs in their efforts to
27 end FGM,

29 (b) Encourages ECOSOC to utilize international volunteer groups in

30 conjunction with the NGOs;

32 2. *Further recommends* efforts to increase awareness of the necessity of prenatal
33 and delivery care for women including:

34

35 (a) The importance of sanitation during the delivery process,

37 (b) Access to appropriate medical care,

39 (c) The prevention and treatment of Fistula;

41 3. *Encourages* the increased education of boys, girls, men, and women about the
42 prevention, transmission, and treatment of HIV/AIDS through international volunteer
43 groups and/or UN organizations.

45 4. *Calls* upon member states, their international community, and the private
46 sector to provide resources to help member states to meet these goals.
