1 2 2	Acknowledging the existence of widespread and continuous violence against women,
3 4	<i>Convinced</i> the education of men and boys is instrumental in achieving progress in
5	this area,

7	Deeply concerned with the pervasiveness of human trafficking and its adverse
8	effects on the status of women,
9	
10	Believing that a worldwide commitment to increase public awareness is necessary
11	in eliminating human trafficking,
12 13	Requests the provelence of rome and domestic violence on the global stage
13 14	<i>Regrets</i> the prevalence of rape and domestic violence on the global stage,
15	Affirming that perpetrators of violence against women should be held legally
16	accountable for their actions,

18	1. Encourages ECOSOC to take action to combat human trafficking by:

20	(a) Following Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Trafficking of
21	Persons, especially women and children,
22 23	(b) Raising awareness of its legal consequences,

27	(d) Urging all member states to pass and enforce legislation to end the
28	exploitation of women and girls that occurs through human trafficking,

30	2. Urges ECOSOC to take a serious, combative stance against rape through:

32	(a) Broaden the definition of rape to include married women,

34	(b) Educating men, boys, women, and girls about the gravity of rape and its
35	consequences,

37	(c) Encouraging communities to educate individuals about measures that
38	can prevent rape;

40	3. <i>Asks</i> ECOSOC to oppose domestic violence through:

42	(a) Encouraging member states to adopt a universal definition of domestic
43	violence,
44 45	(b) Classifying "bonor killing" as a violation of the Universal Declaration
43 46	(b) Classifying "honor killing" as a violation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,
40 47	of fruitair Rights,
48	(c) Requesting member states implement criminal procedures against
49	perpetrators of domestic violence,

51	(d) Increasing gender education within local communities;

53	5. <i>Recognizes</i> the role that sexually violent crimes play in transmitting HIV/AIDS.
