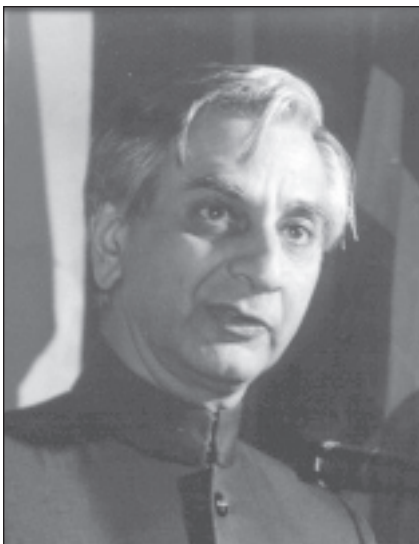

Keynote Speaker: Ambassador Ahmad Kamal



Ambassador Ahmad Kamal will speak at the Opening Ceremonies of the 2005 American Model United Nations International Conference

Ambassador Ahmad Kamal served as a professional diplomat in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan for close to forty years until his retirement in 1999. During this period he held diplomatic postings in India, Belgium, France, the Soviet Union, Saudi Arabia, the Republic of Korea, and with the UN both in Geneva and in New York.

During his decade long assignment as the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Pakistan to the UN, he held many of the highest elective posts, as Vice President of the General Assembly, President of the Economic and Social Council, Chairman of the Consultations on the Role of NGOs at the UN, Chairman of the Working Group on Informatics, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the UN Institute of Training and Research, and a Member of the UN Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions.

Ambassador Kamal was also the chief negotiator of Pakistan in the Uruguay Round negotiations which led to the establishment of the World Trade Organisation, as well as the chief negotiator of Pakistan at the Conference on Disarmament which resulted in the Chemical Weapons Convention.

He continues to be a Senior Fellow of the UN Institute of Training and Research. He is also the Founding President and Chief Executive Officer of The Ambassador's Club at the UN.

He is the author of several important publications on disarmament, management, multilateralism, global economic issues, and technical aspects of informatics and information technology.

He has received numerous honors in Pakistan and in the other countries.

Ambassador Kamal is an Honorary Visiting Professor at several universities in the United States.

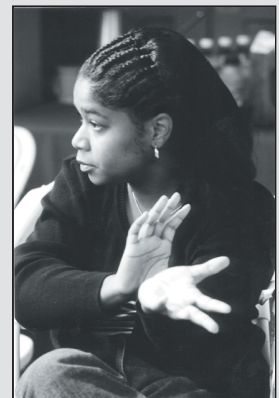

2006 AMUN Conference will be held on
Monday, 21 November 2005.*



Lottery applications are due before 11:00 a.m. on Monday, 21 November 2005. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2006 fees. All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for first choice of country assignments. Schools that register for more than one delegation will be placed in the initial lottery for one delegation, and will be assigned additional delegations following the initial lottery.

Fee discount for all Lottery participants!

Any school that registers through the lottery will receive a \$5.00 PER DELEGATE DISCOUNT on all delegate fees for the 2006 AMUN Conference. Thus if you bring 4 students or 40, AMUN will take \$5.00 off the regular per-delegate fees for each delegate attending. Even if you add additional delegations at a later date, the \$5/delegate discount will still apply.

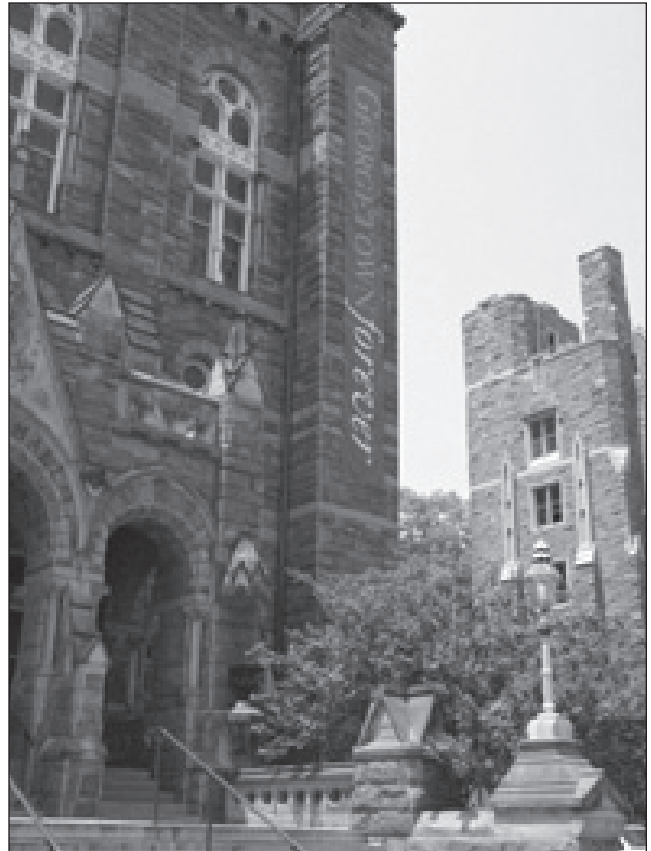

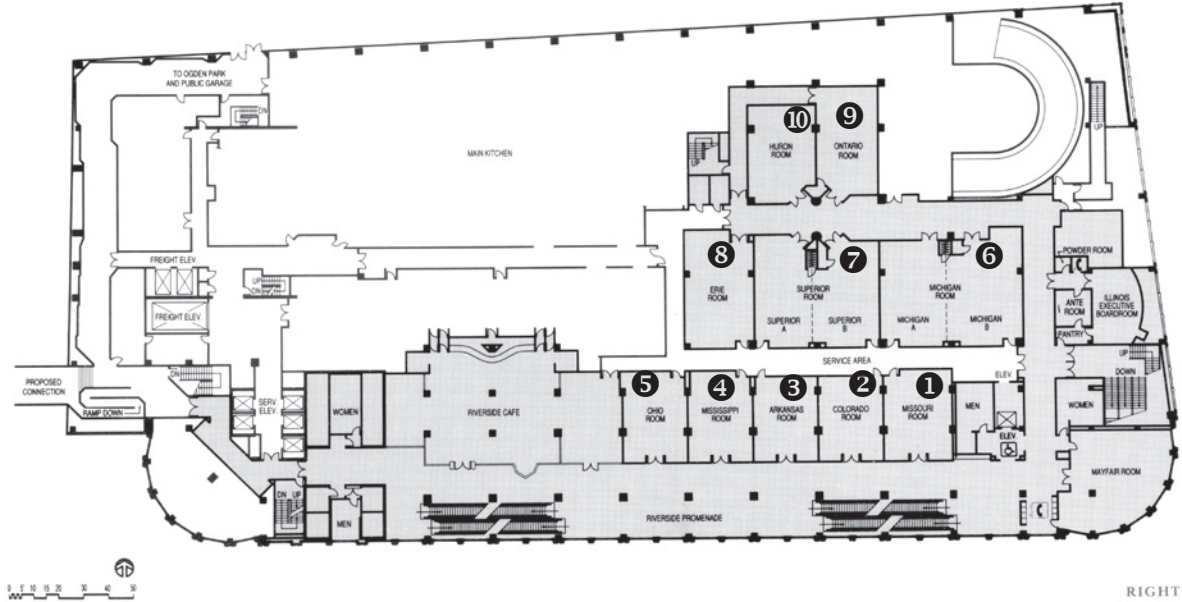

LEVEL 2 • MEETING ROOMS

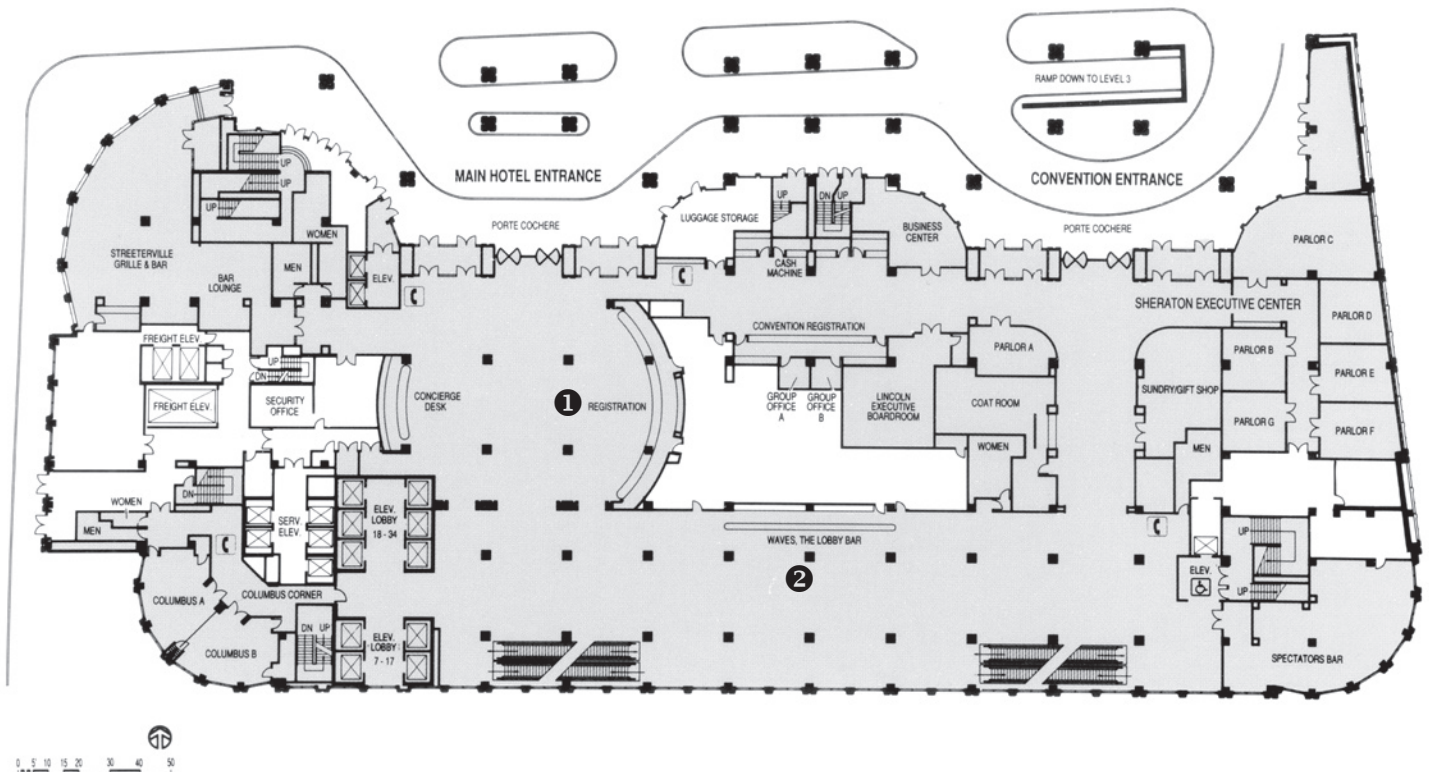

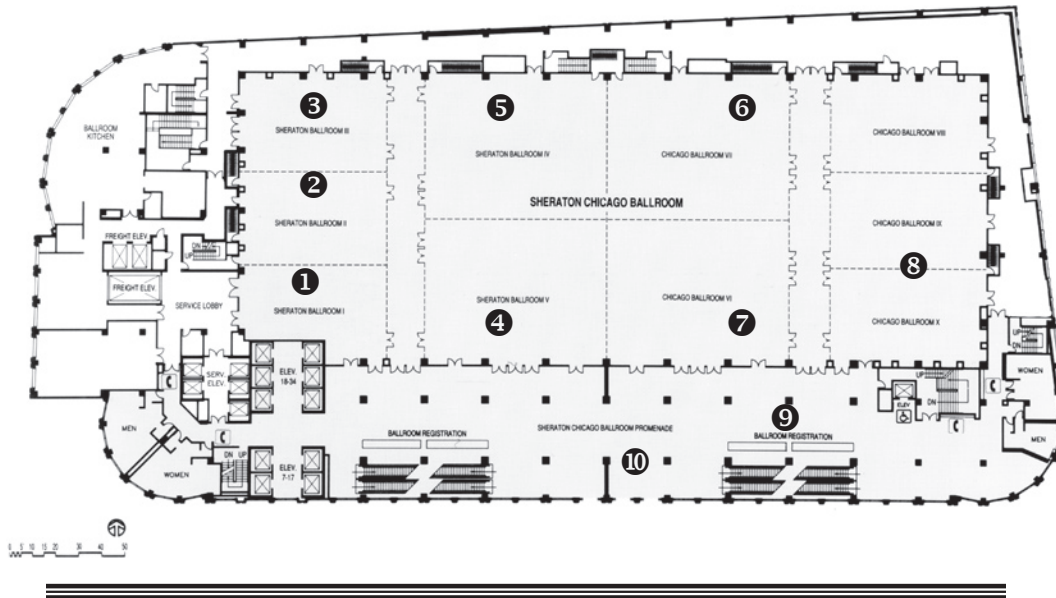
