Alarmed by the continuing spread of HIV/AIDS, malaria, and other preventable diseases around the world,	
Deeply Concerned that AIDS on a large scale impacts the economy, society, population, development, stability, health, and without question, happiness,	
Observing the impact of HIV/AIDS is significantly higher in women than in men,	
Desiring greater economic independence and respect for women, and further reminding that some women are forced into sexual acts in exchange for food and other necessary items for survival,	
<i>Recognizing</i> that malaria is an epidemic in many of the world's poorest countries, affecting an estimated 350 million to 500 million people a year,	
Noting with Approval the success of HIV/AIDS prevention programs such as Adolescent and Youth Friendly Services (YFS), National AIDS Council (NAC), and Canada International Development Agency (CIDA),
