1. Encourages all nations to provide environmental information to their specific regions and form national awareness programs to encourage the communities within the nation to share the responsibility of protecting the environment and conserving resources;

levels in support of accomplishing the goals of the Convention for Biological Diversity;

3. Suggests additional allocation of funds from member nations, NGOs and private donors for the struggle to prevent further drought, and loss of arable land, coral reefs, and biological diversity;

4. Calls upon the United Nations to form environmental bilateral partnerships between the governments of economically and technologically sufficient nations and the countries that need significant aid towards making improvements on their own;

5. Recommends that the nations report their partnerships within the time period of one year to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) within the Department of Economic and Social Affairs;

II. New establishments and existing infrastructure

- 1. Calls for the creation of a more extensive network to promote sharing of technology and aid to meet the 2010 goals outlined in the Convention for Biological Diversity:
- (a) Increase infrastructure support tailored to each state's needs to accommodate environmentally sound technologies to support increased biodiversity,
 - (b) Training local communities in environmentally sound technologies,
- (c) The transfer of environmentally sound technologies, especially in the areas of access to clean water and irrigation;
- 2. Recommends collaboration between the Millennium Development Goals and the goals of the Convention of Biological Diversity recognizing the parallels between the two:
- 3. Emphasizes necessity of establishing the International Biodiversity Data Bank (IBDB) and the World Gene Bank (WGB) under the Biosafety Clearing House to preserve genetic resources in danger of extinction;

4. Further invites the use of the Global Invasive Species Program to provide
80 financial and technological support to States in order to combat the international transfer
81 of non-native species;

III.Regulation

1. *Recommends* that the nations provide annual updates on their progress towards achieving their individual goals to the UNEP;

2. *Encourages* replenishment of deforested areas based on the World Bank's assessment;

3. *Urges* member nations to acknowledge and respect the rights of indigenous people to their resources and the State's sovereignty;

4. *Welcomes* member nations that have not done so to sign and ratify the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Cartagena Protocol, and Kyoto Protocol.
