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5 6	Recognizing every human being's right to food and water,
7	<i>Reaffirming</i> past resolutions and declarations that address the right to food, as
8	well as the commitment of many nations and nongovernmental organizations,
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10 11	Aware of the need for both long term and short term solutions,
12	Emphasizing the issues of aid distribution and security, as well as the investment
12	in technology and education for long term stability,

14	Seeking to utilize previously existing bodies such as the FAO to facilitate the

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37 7. Calls upon donor nations to support existing mechanisms such as the World Food Program and FAO to reevaluate development efforts in order to weed out 38 ineffective programs, thus creating an economically cost effective approach to 39

development for all parties involved; 40

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42 8. Strongly urges the cooperation of member states in accomplishing this goal, because of the clear and undeniable link between the aforementioned issues and the 43 realization of the right to food for all. 44
