The Security Council

- 1 *Recalling* the Security Council's support of ECOWAS in S/RES/1633,
2
3 *Affirming* the principles agreed upon in the Accra III agreement of 31 July 2004,
4
5 *Expressing* concern over the failure of the parties to the Linas-Marcoussis
6 agreement to agree upon the appointment of a new Prime Minister by 31 October 2005,
7
8 *Strongly affirming* the condemnation of all human rights violations in Côte
9 d'Ivoire,
10
11 *Reaffirming* the need to have peaceful elections by 31 October 2006,
12
13 *Acting* under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,
14
15 1. *Encourages* the cessation of discriminatory hereditary voting regulations;

17 2. *Requires* the parties to the Linas-Marcoussis agreement, a representative of the
18 African Union, a representative of ECOWAS, a representative of UNOCI, and a
19 representative from Human Rights Watch submit a report on:

21 (a) current political concerns,
22
23 (b) suggestions for future cooperation,
24
25 (c) plans for mediated peace talks to be presented to the Security Council
26 by March 1, 2006 for the purpose of enabling the Security Council to further facilitate
27 stability and giving all parties political voice;

29 3. *Offers* a place for the facilitation of peace talks following the reports on March
30 1, 2006 for the purpose of ensuring that the elections process occurs smoothly;

4. *Reiterates* the need for disarmament of the Front Nouveau and the current government's militia as explained in S/RES/1633 Operative Clause 17 under the supervision of UNOCI;

5. *Recognizes* the need for stronger border control between Côte d'Ivoire and Liberia;

6. *Orders* some UNOCI forces from the coast to relocate themselves at the planned election centers throughout the country and keep the forces currently at the zone of confidence there;

7. *Urges* more involvement from non-governmental organizations to supply humanitarian aide and reinforce transparency in the election process;

8. *Affirms* the continued impartiality of the Security Council and UNOCI throughout the election and stabilization process;

9. *Fully Supports* the use of ECOWAS's economic development capabilities;

10. *Condemns* any violation of weapons embargo established in Resolution 1584 by all involved parties;

11. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.

Passed by consensus, with 0 abstentions
