SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Peacekeeping

The Security Council

- 1 *Expecting* the significance of peacekeeping operations to increase in the future,
2
3 *Reaffirming* the need for cultural and language training to promote the
4 effectiveness of peacekeeping operations in dealing with non-military personnel,
5
6 *Recognizing* the importance of working in conjunction with those member states
7 experienced in peacekeeping operations,
8
9 *Acknowledging* that peacekeeping operations are a voluntary endeavor,
10
11 *Recognizing* the need of peacekeepers to represent the values and ideals of the
12 United Nations,
13
14 *Concerned* that the lack of cohesion and uniformity of standard operating
15 procedures in peacekeeping operations is detrimental to said operations,
16
17 *Emphasizing* the need for cohesion and uniformity of standard operating
18 procedures to increase the effectiveness of said operations,
19
20 1. *Proclaims* the creation of the United Nations School of Peacekeeping
21 Operations for the purpose of educating future and current peacekeepers and studying
22 past and present peacekeeping operations so as to improve the effectiveness of said
23 operations;

25 2. *Requests* that member states involved in peacekeeping operations send a small
26 contingent of senior Non-Commissioned Officers and Commissioned Officers for the
27 purpose of educating the personnel in peacekeeping operations, so that they may return to
28 their country and share their knowledge;

30 3. *Delegates* the Military Staff Committee of the Security Council to develop and
31 submit a report to the Security Council for approval of standardized doctrine for
32 peacekeeping operations and as well as the formation of the United Nations School of

33 Peacekeeping Operations;

35 *4. Requests* that after a five year period from the establishment of the School that
36 the Military Staff Committee issue a report evaluating the effectiveness and proficiency
37 of the School and the alumni;

39 *5. Notes* that financial support for the School will be provided by Denmark and
40 Japan.
