Recognizing that refugees are vulnerable people,	
Aware that distrust is sometimes fostered between refugee and non-refugee groups, such as, but not limited to, international organizations, aid agencies, and host countries, because of past treatment and disillusionment as to the prospect of improvement of the refugee situations,	
Observing that refugees do not have a medium in which to express their concerns about safety and the meeting of their needs,	
Believing that effective communications and feedback are key to improving overall conditions,	
Guided by the notion that establishment of a program for the enhancement of communication does not require a substantial resource or monetary commitment,	
Convinced that the small resource requirements would provide incentive for world wide support,	
Confident that a program for the enhancement of communication would encourage cooperation as an essential tool for development,	
1. <i>Identifies</i> the forum of dialogue between refugees and the UNHCR as the Panel for Effective Refugee Communication (PERC);	
2. <i>Emphasizes</i> dialogue that includes identification of problems and suggestions for resolutions of problems;	
3. <i>Recommends</i> that suggestions for resolutions of problems include discussion of available resources and consider lobbying as a tool to obtain necessary resources when	

they are not available or sufficient; 31 32 33 4. Expresses its hope that improved communication will build trust within the refugee population, as well as between refugees, UNCHR, and other aid organizations; 34 35 36 5. *Notes* that establishing trust within the refugee population creates the framework for cooperation, and cooperation enables training, such as educational or 37 public health campaigns, and development programs for refugees to take hold; 38 39 40 6. Proclaims that the successful implementation of this empowerment program is 41 a positive step in working toward self-sufficiency for refugees; 42 43 7. Emphasizes that self-sufficiency strengthens Convention Plus and repatriation 44 efforts.
