Noting with high priority the issue of repatriated refugees,
<i>Recognizing</i> the need to revise outdated information analysis of the economic and social costs of repatriation,
<i>Bearing in mind</i> previous studies done on repatriation and results showing little emphasis on socioeconomic factors,
<i>Confident</i> that burden sharing is a humanitarian duty that will alleviate much of the financial strain caused by a disproportionate number of refugees,
1. Encourages voluntary repatriation in order to increase refugees' self-sustainability;
2. Seeks a country-specific model for cost analysis and resource sharing;
3. <i>Suggests</i> that this body investigate repatriation activity to produce a study on the socioeconomic costs and collective social impact of repatriatio;
4. <i>Pledges</i> UNHCR support to regional efforts, with assistance of NGOs, for monitoring repatriation into places of origin;
5. <i>Emphasizes</i> the necessity of the UNHCR in promoting multilateral frameworks to provide host countries with international support;
6. <i>Designates</i> April 29th as International Refugee Repatriation Day with a corresponding forum to be held in Brussels annually on this day to consider progress made by multilateral conversations.
