The Economic and Social Council

1 *Noting* the existing prevalence of bias in the distribution of aid based on religious
2 and political ideologies,
3

4 *Recognizing* that the delivery of aid is most effective through cooperation on both
5 governmental and non-governmental levels, such as the United Nations Development
6 Programm South-South Cooperation, which encourages developing states to mobilize
7 resources and help one another,
8

9 *Additionally noting* the need for the exploration of the United Nations Global
10 Compact, which entails cooperation and coordination between businesses and
11 underdeveloped countries to promote investment and stresses the importance of sound
12 business practices,
13

14 *Recognizing* the need for the increased focus on the development of human
15 capital,
16

17 1. *Calls upon* member nations to promote the sharing of technology, especially in
18 the agriculture sector, to underdeveloped nations in an effort to assist them on the path
19 toward industrialization;

21 2. *Expresses* its hope for member states to explore aid schemes aimed at increased
22 efficiency and promotion of sustainable domestic development;

24 (a) Recommends the use of the recognized tactics prove effective in the past, such
25 as bottom-up development schemes and the use of grassroots and non-governmental
26 organizations;
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28 (b) Encourages donor countries to promote efficient and responsible use of aid

30 through a rewards-based system of continual assessment, carried out by impartial
31 observers, with the promise of further funding after the first three years of
32 implementation;

34 (c) Urge donor states to focus on the development of human capital through
35 increased support for health care, education and other fundamental needs the populations
36 to promote long-term development schemes;

37

38 3. *Requests* member states to set aside religious and political ideologies so as to
39 decrease the bias of donors in the distribution of aid to recipient states;

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41 4. *Encouraging* applicable member states to explore the possibilities of debt relief
42 to underdeveloped nations, especially those considered to be in extreme poverty highly
43 indebted, most impoverished nations.
