1	Recognizing the importance of education in relation to enhancing the role of
2	women in society,
3	
4	Acknowledging the discrepancies of educational and workplace opportunities in
5	many parts of the world,
6	
7	Noting with appreceiation the efforts of member states in implementing a gender
8	perspective into policies and programs,
9	
10	Welcoming the progress made by the United Nations body following the Beijing
11	Declaration and Platform for Action on woman's global situation,
12	
13	Guided by Article IX of the United Nations Charter which asserts universal human
14	rights for peoples regardless of race, sex, language or religion,
15	
16	Deeply regretting the inability of equal representation by the year 2000, and also
17	noting the insufficient employment of women serving at the UN in any position, in which
18	the growth rate was only 0.4% in 2004,
19	
20	Noting with appreceiation the progress made by individual member states in
21	addressing a component of gender mainstreaming by attaining the goal of 30% female
22	representation in political decision-making,
23	
24	1. Encourages that resources be further diverted to the training and education of
25	women so they can fill more diverse roles in the job market, thereby equitably increasing
26	both development and the number of women in governments where women are
27	underrepresented;

29 30	2. <i>Endorses</i> policies that bring about equality in the global work place for women in regards to equal pay and rights;
31 32	3. Calls upon states to adhere to the Convention on the Elimination of all Forms
33	of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) to close the gaps between policies and
34	their implementation;

36	4. <i>Applauds</i> the work UNIFEM has done to promote gender equality and
37	implement the Beijing Platform for Action
38	
39	5. <i>Encourages</i> the use of the World's Womean 2000 framework to highlight
40	differential impacts of development programs on men and women and provide for more
41	beneficial policy formation in the future;
42	
43	6. <i>Calls upon</i> states to further implement policies that work towards
44 45	mainstreaming a gender perspective, while recognizing the importance of cultural
45	sensitivity;
46 47	7. <i>Requests</i> that all entities of the UN system, including UN agencies, funds and
47 48	programs, take the following steps in order to achieve the goal of mainstreaming a gender
49	perspective into all UN policies and programs:
50	
51	(a) coordinating activities with like-minded organizations to devise a cohesive and
52	sufficient plan of action in order to remedy the gap between policy commitments and
53	implementation;

55	(b) provide annually updated training seminars to all staff to ensure gender
56	mainstreaming occurs equally throughout the UN;
57	
58	(c) fund efforts to create new and improved technologies to gather and aggregate
59	reliable information within the UN and by member states;

61	8. Welcomes an updated annual report on the commitments made by the UN to
62	mainstreaming gender into all policies and programs by the Secretary General.
