SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION:	Support by the United Nations System of the Efforts of Governments to Promote and Consolidate New or Restored Democracies

Recalling Article 1 of the UN Charter, and the Ulaanbaatar Declaration which states that Democratic societies show solidarity toward others and respect their sovereignty,	
<i>Reaffirming</i> resolution 60/253 and report 60/556 which state "there is no single model of democracy and that it does not belong to any country or region, and reaffirming further the necessity of due respect for sovereignty and the right to self-determination",	
Further reaffirming the need of the international community to recognize the national sovereignty of all nation states as stated in resolutions 58/281, 58/13, and 52/12,	
<i>Reaffirming</i> that intervention in the affairs of member states is considered to be a breach of the UN Charter which clearly states that no state has the right to intervene in the affairs of other member states,	
<i>Believeing</i> that states can and will develop a progressive and stable democracy when their ideals and beliefs are able to be exercised and recognized by the international community as summarized in resolutions 59/201 and 60/162,	
Stressing the fact that transparency in the management of public services is an important element in promoting democracy and democratic institutions,	
Recognizing the importance of the international community in assisting other states in their transition toward democracy in areas such financing, determining appropriate models of democracy and educating the public of the mechanics of democracy,	
Welcoming the use of the United Nations Trust Fund for Electoral Observation, UN Democracy Fund, NGO's and regional funds for new and restored democracies,	

Having considered the importance of social, cultural and economic stability as a

necessary part in establishing a stable democracy,

*Noting with concern* that poverty is a major issues in stabilizing democracies and all nations,

*Fully supporting* the efforts of multilateral organizations in their support for developing democracy,

Fully believing in the importance of the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals for all member states in promoting conditions such as education and social conditions which are conducive to new and restored democracies.

1. *Encourages* member states to increase support for the promotion of democratic processes in a peaceful and inclusive manner;

2. *Proclaims* that the international community should respect the sovereignty of a country before, during, and after they choose to develop a democratic government;

3. Further encourages states to improve economic stability by assuring that their available economic, natural, and intellectual resources benefit the majority of the general public of its nation;

4. *Urges* appropriate local, national, and regional groups such as the Organization of American States, African Union, United Arab League and Organization of Pacific States to organize conferences and other relevant groups when an issue involving multiple parties arises within a region;

5. *Approves* the utilization of UNESCO and other relevant bodies in educating peoples in the functions and purpose of democracy to promote participation of democracy;

6. *Recommends* the use of the UN Development Program, NGO's and other organizations in reducing poverty as a mechanism for developing and maintaining stable democracies;

 7. *Endorses* UN resolution 60/253, which states "recognizing democracy as a universal value based in the freely expressed will of people to determine their own political, economic, social and cultural systems and their full participation in all aspect of their lives";

8. *Supports* state use of the UN Democracy Fund, civil organizations and funds when developing democracies and establishing their model of democracy.
