1 2 3	<i>Guided by</i> the World Health Organization's belief in enhancing capacity-building in global public health,	
4 5	<i>Noting with deep regret</i> that even in the 21 st century the advances of modern medicine are still not available to the millions that suffer all over the globe from preventable	
6 7	disease such as malaria, tuberculosis, and HIV/AIDS,	
8	<i>Recognizing</i> that developing nations are experiencing a shortage of nearly 1.5 million	
9 10	doctors and nurses,	
11 12	<i>Convinced</i> "that the globalization of trade and increased international travel have increased the risk of a rapid worldwide spread of infectious diseases, posing new	
13 14	challenges to public health," as stated in resolution 59/27,	
15 16 17	<i>Reaffirming</i> resolution 58/3 that Member States must strengthen their efforts in order to halt the spread of and combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases by 2015,	
18 19	<i>Reminding</i> the members of their financial commitment to the Millennium Development Goals,	
20 21 22	<i>Fully believing</i> that these problems cannot be solved without a proper infrastructure, which includes equality and appropriate funding,	
23 24	1. Urges Member States:	
25	(a) to commit to funding of education at the elementary and secondary levels to	
26 27	provide an adequate knowledge base to prepare individuals for higher education;	
28 29	(b) to fund medical schools and new health care facilities;	
30 31	(c) to support initiatives that entice skilled medical personnel to stay in their developing nations thereby rectifying the shortage;	
32 33	2. <i>Encourages</i> nations with advanced communication systems to assist the spread of	

- 35 the internet and feasible access to medical research through education and funding and 36 backing an infrastructure that supports the internet, such as electricity;

- 38 3. *Appeals* to Member States with advanced medical technology to provide means
 39 for reusing medical equipment in the developing world;

41 4. *Calls upon* Member States to make life saving drugs more accessible to those who
 42 need them most;
