The Third Committee

- 1 *Recalling* the goals set out by all member states within the framework of the
2 United Nations Millennium Declaration,
3
4 *Reaffirming* Resolution 2004/7 passed by the Commission on Human Rights, and
5 the establishment of the High- Level Task Force on the implementation of the Right to
6 Development,
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8 *Recognizing* the right of peoples to self-determination, by virtue of which they
9 have the right to freely determine their political status and to pursue their economic,
10 social and cultural development,
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12 *Realizing* that Economic Development expands the availability of work and the
13 ability of individuals to secure an income to support themselves and their families,
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15 *Keeping in mind* that active participation in sustainable development ensures that
16 those who are affected by changes are the ones determining the changes,
17
18 *Taking into account* that Social Conditions such as lack of education and
19 information as well as poor health conditions severely limit a person's ability to work and
20 enjoy personal economic growth and development,
21
22 1. *Calls upon* all Member States to take action towards the constant improvement
23 of the well-being of the entire population and of all individuals, on the basis of their
24 active, free and meaningful participation in development;
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26 2. *Emphasizes* that the Right to Development is a comprehensive economic,
27 social, cultural and political process;
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29 3. *Affirms* that Economic Development shall include industry, sustainable
30 agriculture, as well as integration and full participation in the global economy;
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32 4. *Calls for* the active participation by those affected by such changes in

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33 development, such participation is not exclusive in ensuring equitable input, self-
34 determination, and employment of both genders and all races or cultural groups;

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36 5. *Promotes* the formation of a global forum under the United Nations Division
37 for Sustainable Development, comprised of regional representatives which would include
38 the following:

39
40 (a) Participation in such dialogue and information sharing shall be free of cost;
41 (b) Would aid in the spreading of information on the global level in regards to
42 information of all kinds, including but not limited to:

- 43 (i) financial resources;
- 44 (ii) political techniques;
- 45 (iii) vocational information;
- 46 (iv) technological resources;
- 47 (v) medical advancements;

48 (c) Would be broken down first on a country-by-country level, in which
49 participating nations would have the ability to stock-pile information on a regional level,
50 and spread the transparency of this information to the forum globally;

52 6. *Calls for* technical assistance that can be offered by agriculture organization of
53 the United Nations, which supports sustainable development, and incorporates
54 development programs geared towards sustaining agriculture, water management, and
55 other various misappropriations of agrarian knowledge, including but not limited to:

- 56 (a) water pump technologies;
- 57 (b) terra-forming farming;

59 7. *Supports* the provision and installation of technologically advanced water
60 systems in schools, health centers, and HIV- affected areas by voluntary public-private
61 partnerships, which will, produce energy to pump and purify badly needed drinking water
62 to not only rural areas lacking access to water, but those which lack sanitation as well;

64 8. *Calls on* member states to ensure indigenous people have the right to maintain
65 control over their own social and economic development, the right to participate and offer
66 input to national and regional development plans that affect them, and the right to the
67 protection of their natural environment;

68
69 9. *Strongly suggests* nations to develop a strong and working educational
70 infrastructure which would include the building of schools and improvement of already
71 existing schools:

- 72 (a) Provide vocational training on the building and running of these schools to
73 people within the community to provide more job opportunities within that community;
- 74 (b) Funding for this development would be provided by the United Nations
75 Commission for Sustainable Development.
