1 2 3	<i>Recognizing</i> the sovereignty of all member states and their inalienable right to self defense,
4 5 6	<i>Bearing in mind</i> the Security Council's goal of providing a forum for the achievement of peaceful solutions to international conflicts,
0 7 8	<i>Taking note</i> of the reports that an unmanned surveillance drone belonging to the United States was shot down while operating in Iranian airspace,
8 9	Onned States was shot down while operating in framan anspace,
10 11 12 13	<i>Realizing fully</i> that these have been confirmed by the United States government, and their representatives have asserted that the entry into Iranian airspace was unintentional,
13 14 15 16	Also realizing the expulsion of all International Atomic Energy Association (IAEA) inspectors from within Iran,
17 18 19	Affirming the right of all nations to operate within their own borders as the nation sees fit,
20 21 22	<i>Taking into account</i> the announcements of the Iranian government that it has chosen to raise its armed forces to a heightened state of alert,
23 24 25	<i>Concerned</i> by the potential reverberations of the aforementioned Iranian decision may have on the international community and the stability of the region,
26 27 28	<i>Reaffirming</i> the duty of member states to exhaust diplomatic negotiations before pursuing punitive measures of any sort;
29 30 31 32	1. <i>Expresses</i> its determination to enhance the effectiveness of the United Nations in preventing armed conflicts and to monitor closely situations of potential armed conflict;
32 33 34	2. <i>Advises</i> all involved parties to work multilaterally within the United Nations framework;

35 36	3. <i>Encourages</i> all nations to honor their commitments to comprehensive solutions

37	to threats of international peace and security;

39	4. Welcomes the negotiating efforts undertaken by parties committed to the
40	peaceful resolution of international disputes and encourages them to continue their
41	efforts;

43	5. Informs the international community of its intention to monitor this situation
44	with caution and pragmatism;

46	6. Requests the Secretary General continue to update the council on any
47	developments in this situation to assist in its monitoring;

49	7. Decides to remain actively seized on the issue.
