1	<i>Noting</i> that the age structure in developed nations is changing at an unprecedented

5	and international organizations in order to ensure that the needs of this growing political
6	and economic force is adequately utilized and tended to,

8	Guided by the International Plan of Action on Aging which was endorsed by
9	Resolution 37/51 in 1982,

11	1. Encourages the increased viability of, and access to, quality medical assistance
12	for the growing elderly population in order to maintain the mental and physical
13	health of this emergent demographic group;

17	the current aged population into the workforce so as to alleviate their economic
