

2007 Keynote Speaker Senator Robert Krueger

AMUN is pleased to introduce our keynote speaker, Robert Krueger. Bob Krueger has had a variety of careers. As an academic, he holds a Doctor of Philosophy degree from Oxford University, and served as a Professor of English and as Vice Provost and Dean of the Undergraduate College of Arts

and Sciences at Duke University. In the business world, he has done private consulting, served as Chairman of the Board of Comal Hosiery Mills, and as President of Krueger Associates.

Later, in public service, Krueger first served his state as Texas Railroad Commissioner, a statewide elected office responsible for regulating all oil and gas production in Texas. He has also served his nation both in elective and appointive office. He was a Member of Congress in the U.S. House of Representatives and was later U.S. Senator from Texas.

And then as a diplomat, he served as U.S. Ambassador-at-Large and Coordinator for Mexican Affairs, as U.S. Ambassador to Burundi, and then as U.S. Ambassador to Botswana and Special Representative of the U.S. Secretary of State to the 14 nations of the Southern African Development Community (SADC).

During his service in Burundi, which occurred shortly after the genocide in neighboring Rwanda, Krueger's outspokenness on human rights issues provoked an ambush of his convoy in which two persons were killed and eight grievously wounded, although the gunfire piercing his car missed all passengers.

As a writer he has published a book on English Literature, a variety of articles, and for over four years he wrote a weekly column for several Texas newspapers. His book on living amid genocide in Burundi was released in October, 2007, by the University of Texas Press. In his foreword, Nobel Laureate Desmond Tutu writes, "This is an important book about Africa, but it is not simply the story of Africans or Americans, but of all of us." Paul Rusesabagina, the hero and inspiration for the movie Hotel Rwanda, says, "This book is a wake-up call. Read it. It will humble, teach, and inspire you."

Bob Krueger currently engages in consulting, investing, writing, and public speaking. He lives with his wife and three daughters in his childhood home in New Braunfels, Texas.

Conference will be held on Monday, 19 November 2007.


Lottery applications are due to the Executive Office in the Ohio room before 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, 18 November 2007. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2008 fees. All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for first choice of country assignments. Schools that register for more than one delegation will be placed in the initial lottery for one delegation, and will be assigned additional delegations following the initial lottery.

Fee discount for all Lottery participants!

Any school that registers through the lottery will receive a \$5.00 PER DELEGATE DISCOUNT on all delegate fees for the 2008 AMUN Conference. Thus if you bring 5 students or 50, AMUN will take \$5.00 off the regular per-delegate fees for each delegate attending. Even if you add additional delegations at a later date, the \$5/delegate discount will still apply.





Formed in 1969 and named for Virginia Gildersleeve, noted woman educator and internationalist, the fund to date has more than 300 grants for a total project aid disbursement of over \$1.3 million USD to women's groups in 88 low per capita income countries. Priority is given to income generation and community development projects which enhance and utilize women's educational, vocational, and leadership skills. Project activities range from seminars, conferences, and training workshops to community-action projects.

With NGO consultative status at the UN, VGIF has 1,200 members in 40 countries who generously support the Fund's mission with their annual donations and planned or estate gifts. The 29 member volunteer board, broadly international in scope, serves at its own expense.

We can be reached in the Ohio Room, located on the second level of the Sheraton Hotel, or find any Secretariat member wearing a blue badge. If an emergency occurs that requires immediate help, you should also feel free to contact hotel security (Dial 0 and ask the operator for "security") for assistance.




