SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy

The General Assembly

1 *Guided by* the language used in Security Council Resolution 1566, operative
2 clause three, which sets forth the parameters for a definition of Terrorism,

3
4 *Strongly condemning* international terrorist organizations which are violating
5 fundamental human rights,

6
7 *Recalling* A/RES/59/23 which promotes inter-religious dialogue and the positive
8 effects such dialogue can have on the prevention of terrorist attacks,

9
10 *Deeply concerned* that certain states are harboring terrorist organizations,

11
12 1. *Requests* that member states take appropriate measures to self monitor their
13 funds to ensure those funds are not used to fund terrorist organizations, whether directly
14 or indirectly, intentionally or unintentionally;

15
16 2. *Recommends* that all nations adopt and support the universal declaration on
17 human rights;

18
19 3. *Further recommends* that all member states sign and ratify the existing 12
20 international conventions on terrorism;

22 4. *Strongly encourages* an expansion of the purview of the Department of
23 Peacekeeping Operations so that peacekeepers will be able to enter member states, upon
24 request, and train their police services in anti-terrorism measures including:

- 25 (a) Airport Security
26 (b) Post-Blast investigation
27 (c) Dignitary Protection
28 (d) Senior Policy Workshops
29 (e) Basic Border Security

31 5. *Endorses* the creation of a summit to begin meeting in 2008 for the purpose of
32 pragmatic discussion of the proactive options of combating terrorism which would be
33 made up of both regional organizations and counter terrorism experts representing
34 multilateral interests;

36 6. *Calls Upon* the aforementioned summit to create an effective international
37 counter terrorism strategy which would include the following elements:

- 38 (a) Sharing of various border control strategies based upon the specific
39 borders and needs of nations so that they may better defend their
40 borders against terrorism,
41 (b) Assessments of the technological needs of regions and member states
42 to increase both the fight against terrorism and the ability to share
43 information,
44 (c) An open dialogue on the policy differences which exist between
45 members states and regional bodies,
46 (d) The creation of an annual report on their findings so that this body
47 may discuss and implement their suggestions.
