<i>Recalling</i> resolutions S/RES/1735 (2006), S/RES/1634 (2005) and S/RES/1535 (2004), strengthening S/RES/1735 (2006) in terms of the prevention of sales, transfer and supply of all military supplies and monetary aid,		
Guided by the United Nations Charter in preserving peace and security and severely condemning acts of terrorism in all forms and manifestations regardless of the actor(s) and/or timeframe,		
Recognizing that information sharing between neighboring states allows individual states to strengthen their own borders for security when a terrorist group is in the general vicinity,
