SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy

*The General Assembly*

1 *Reaffirming* that terrorism, in all forms, is considered one of the most dangerous  
2 threats to peace and security as stated in S/RES/1535 (2004),  
3

4 *Recalling* resolutions S/RES/1735 (2006), S/RES/1634 (2005) and S/RES/1535  
5 (2004), strengthening S/RES/1735 (2006) in terms of the prevention of sales, transfer and  
6 supply of all military supplies and monetary aid,  
7

8 *Guided by* the United Nations Charter in preserving peace and security and  
9 severely condemning acts of terrorism in all forms and manifestations regardless of the  
10 actor(s) and/or timeframe,  
11

12 *Recognizing that* information sharing between neighboring states allows  
13 individual states to strengthen their own borders for security when a terrorist group is in  
14 the general vicinity,  
15

16 1. *Calls for* the establishment of a system of information sharing between borders;  
17

18 (A) Encourages the flow of information in regards to terrorism to  
19 neighboring states;

20 (i) Providing that through an application process, any or all of the  
21 following incentives be available for states that comply with the  
22 information sharing system, depending on each state's  
23 individual situation;

24 (a) Increases the availability of technological assistance  
25 from the United Nations in the form of grants to UN  
26 subcontractors for a specific state;

27 (b) Provides additional security measures such as local  
28 military and police training and additional peacekeepers,

29 (c) Suggests that additional funding, from subcommittees  
30 in the United Nations, be available for counter-terrorism  
efforts;

31 (B) Emphasizes further transparency by encouraging individual states to  
32 disclose information to one another in regards to, and to allow the  
33 United Nations to continue to monitor:

- 34 (i) The transfer of all arms and nuclear shipments in  
35 regards to terrorist activities;  
36 (ii) The movement of terrorist groups;

38 2. *Endorses* continued efforts to increase dialogue and understanding among  
39 civilizations to prevent prejudice of different cultures and religions.
