19 20 21	Acknowledging the efforts of Central Asian States to achieve a nuclear weapon- free zone,

25 26 27	<i>Recognizing</i> the incalculable threat to peace caused by the presence and proliferation of nuclear weapons,	
27 28 29 30	<i>Keeping in mind</i> that nuclear further non-proliferation and eventuation	weapon-free zones are an effective step towards al complete disarmament,

31 Confident that nuclear weapon-free zones will help strengthen non-proliferation 32 and will give new impetus towards negotiation within the framework of the United 33 Nations. 34 35 *Regarding* the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT), and the potential creation of a Fissile Material Cut-off Treaty and the Additional Safeguard 36 37 agreements as profoundly important measures to preventing both the proliferation of 38 nuclear weapons and further global insecurity, 39 40 *Reaffirming* the right of countries to establish specified zones free of nuclear 41 weapons stated under Article VII of the NPT, 42 43 1. Strongly Urges the creation of nuclear weapon-free zones in the Eastern Europe 44 and the Balkan Peninsula; 45 46 2. Calls Upon the States of Eastern Europe and of the Balkan Peninsula to commit 47 to a permanent state of nuclear self-restraint, declaring the States included in this zone to 48 be : Albania, Belarus, Bosnia, & Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, 49 Estonia, The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, 50 Lithuania, Moldova, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Montenegro, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, 51 and Ukraine. 52 53 3. Urges these States to join in a common treaty with adequate agendas and 54 perspicuous parameters for creating a nuclear weapon-free zone, including but not limited 55 to a secure border around the proposed nuclear weapon-free zone, transparency regarding 56 the transport of nuclear materials within, across, or into that zone, and freely share the information regarding the movements of such materials; 57 58 59 4. Requests the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) to administer 60 comprehensive safeguards and monitor state-parties' nuclear-related activities; 61 62 5. *Promotes* the unbiased education of the public by means of United Nations 63 Regional Centres for Peace and Disarmament (UNREC) and NGOs, for the advancement 64 of transparency, voluntary compliance, and self-determination; 65 6. Deplores any sort of manufacturing, testing, acquisition, intention to acquire, 66 67 deployment, or possession of nuclear weapons in the proposed nuclear weapon-free zone; 68 69 7. Requests these States to follow all recommendations described above in accordance with the established NATO treaty and agreements and specifically respect 70 71 transport agreements and military treaties with the Russian Federation in order to further 72 the control of weapons.
