Distressed by use of the act of rape as a tool of warfare and the subsequent fleeing of women from their homes due to this threat,

1. *Expresses* the belief that it is imperative for actions to be taken toward the protection of women during armed conflict from all exploitative and harmful acts, not excluding those committed by United Nations peacekeeping personnel;

33	2. Strongly urges Member States to work in conjunction with the Office of
