SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East SUBMITTED TO: The Fourth Committee SUBMITTED BY: Jordan, Saudi Arabia, Lebanon, Islamic Republic of Iran, Oman, Hungary, Kuwait, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Netherlands The Fourth Committee Having examined the Report of the Working Group on the Financing of United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) on 25 September 2007, Deeply disturbed with the matter of demurrage, storage and transportation charges levied upon the Agency by Israel equaling \$1.4 million in 2006, inducing further strain on the Agency's already mounting financial crisis, Further concerned that as of September 2007 the Agency remains \$106 million dollars under funded for the fiscal year, Deeply regretting that such a deficit in the UNRWA's funding would not only lead to non-implementation of the Medium Term Plan but also further deteriorates the living conditions of the Palestinian refugees, Noting with satisfaction the Commissioner-General and United Nations Relief and Works Agency for all their efforts in these trying times and doing their best despite their depleted resources, 1. Calls upon the occupying power to cease obstruction of the UNRWA's ability to fulfill its mandate and allow humanitarian aid; as affirmed in the 1946 Geneva Convention regarding the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations; 2. Further calls upon Israeli authorities to exempt UNRWA of all transit charges as reported in A/62/361;

3. Strongly encourages the government of Israel to make reparation to the

UNRWA for past damages to facilities and property;

30	4. Reaffirms the concern over the endangerment of the Agency staff and strongly
31	deplores the killing and wounding of refugees or Agency staff members by Israeli forces
32	(A/61/114);

34	5. Calls upon once again that all parties concerned implement with UNRWA in
35	their humanitarian efforts;

37	6. Expresses its hope that Member States' generosity would continue to help
38	provide vital assistance in whatever means available, including but not limited to: human
39	resources, educational resources, medical aid, food aid, financial and technical assistance;
40	
41	7. Further urges Israel to facilitate the uninhibited movement of Palestinian
42	refugees for means necessary to support their livelihoods.
