1 *Reaffirming* the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the Convention
2 on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women (A/RES/62/218),
3

4 *Recognizing* the work of this Commission both previous and subsequent actions
5 taken towards promoting socioeconomic equality for women,
6

7 *Seeking* further progress in the implementation of programs and towards gender
8 equality,
9

10 *Noting with satisfaction* the high success and return rate of social and economic
11 programs for women,
12

13 *Aware of* the need for increased social and economic security for women,
14

15 *Realizing* that issues facing women vary throughout the region and only through
16 an integrated approach will any of these issues begin to be resolved,
17

18 1. *Expresses* its hope that Member States use all available outlets to end
19 discrimination on the basis of sex;
20

21 2. *Notes* that through comprehensive sex education for both men and women the
22 instances of sexually based offenses can be reduced;

24 3. *Endorses* increased support for maternal health in accordance with the
25 Millennium Development Goals;

- 27 4. *Encourages* the protection of a degree of sexual and reproductive rights,
28 combatting the spread of sexually transmitted infections, such as HIV/AIDS;

- 30 5. *Emphasizing* the importance of the creation and renovation of pre-existing
31 community facilities to house and provide security to victims of domestic assault and
32 abuse;

- 34 6. *Recommends* long-term regional campaigns that diffuse the stigma associated
35 with women who have been victims of domestic violence.
