### *The Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean*

- 1        *Noting with satisfaction* the existence of exchange programs within the teaching  
2 profession that are trying to make a difference,  
3
- 4        *Acknowledging* the professional exchanges in the medical field that are already  
5 taking place between multiple Member States of ECLAC,  
6
- 7        *Noting with regret* the absence of education in rural areas and in particular its  
8 effects on the women and girls in the said areas,  
9
- 10       *Recognizing* the difficulties faced by teachers in rural areas including but not  
11 limited to the areas of economy and safety,  
12
- 13       *Acknowledging* the benefits of comprehensive health-care education in rural areas,  
14
- 15       *Reaffirming* every State's right to set curricula,  
16
- 17       1. *Urges* individual governments to provide subsidies and free training in the  
18 teaching profession;  
19
- 20       2. *Suggests* the formation of a 'Teachers Without Borders' program that would  
21 allow teachers to work comfortably in the rural regions of Latin America and the  
22 Caribbean without restrictions imposed by national identity;

- 24       3. *Encourages* governments to train teachers in exchange for their agreement to  
25 teach in rural areas;

- 27       4. *Recommends* that the individuals who participate in this project work for a term  
28 limit that is designated by their own countries;

30                   5. *Calls upon* ECLAC to work with other NGOs to aid in the organization and  
31 actualization of this program;

33                   6. *Suggests* that States actively recruit women into these programs.
