SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: United Nations Public-Private Alliance for Rural Development

1 *Guided* by the respect of each state's sovereignty,

2

3 *Stressing* the importance of the Millennium Development Goals,

4

5 *Reaffirming* the fact that economic and social infrastructure, including public
6 transportation, water and land management, power supply, and telecommunications is
7 vital to achieving the Millennium goals,

8

9 *Conscious* of the importance of interaction between rural and urban areas in their
10 approach to development,

11

12 *Convinced* of the importance of the involvement of each member state in the
13 United Nations Public-Private Alliance(UNPPA),

14

15 *Recognizing* a need for a more diverse sample of pilot countries that could
16 adequately represent the different regions of the world,

17

18 *Bearing in mind* the important distinction between the submission of an
19 application and its subsequent acceptance,

20

21 *Understanding* the need for prudence and regard prior to full implementation,

22

23 1. *Urges* the UNPPA to call for applications from interested nations of regions
24 of the world not currently involved in this program for vetting purposes to promote
25 proper transparency, good governance, and assurance of sustainability;

27 2. *Recommends* that the UNPPA evaluates these applications in terms of their
28 diverse socioeconomic needs that are not currently represented by the pilot countries;

30 3. *Further recommends* that UNPPA evaluate applications with regard to
31 expanding the socioeconomic diversity of the pilot programs, and suggests that diverse

32 developing regions be considered;

34 4. *Calls upon* the UNPPA to administer a review period of three years to facilitate
35 the implementation of the program in further countries;

37 5. *Reaffirms* its commitment to the development of the current pilot countries
38 prior to full implementation of the program in other nations.
