1 2 3	<i>Recognizing</i> the importance of economic sustainability and development in areas including, but not limited to, the environment, technology, and humanitarian issues,
4 5	Understanding the importance of industrial development in successful implementation of the Millennium Development Goals by 2015,
6 7	<i>Fully aware of</i> the intrinsic link between agricultural and industrial development,
8	
9 10	Encouraging industrial diversification to promote economic stability,
11	Convinced of the benefits of increased trade between emerging markets,
12 13	particularly those located in the global South,
14	Further convinced that programs such as the Web of Information for
15 16	Development (WIDE) and United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) promote the open exchange of technological information,
17	(ONDO) promote the open exchange of technological mormation,
18 19	1. <i>Encourages</i> the development of human capital through vastly improved and expanded education and healthcare by:
20	(a) Recommending that the Economic and Social Council and the United
21	Nations Development Programme extend their focus on the improvement of education
22 23	and healthcare; (b) Bridging the urban/rural divide by equally allocating resources to both
24	sectors;
25 26	2. Draws attention to the undue burden that industry-specific subsidies and market
27	dumping place on domestic industries in developing countries;
28 29	2. Endoward the notantial honofite of South South Cooperation analysis the
29	3. Endorses the potential benefits of South-South Cooperation, specifically in the

30	areas of information and technology transfers that facilitate domestic ownership of capital
31	in order to create sustainable job growth within developing economies;

33	4. Encourages consistent trade liberalization policies which promote the free flow
34	of capital across state boundaries and open access to markets for lesser developed
35	countries;

37	5. Supports the establishment of business expositions that allow the transmission
38	of good business practices, development of ethical standards, and demonstration of new
39	technologies;

41	6. <i>Recommends</i> further incorporation of the objectives of the Special Unit for
42	South-South Cooperation including:
43	(a) Development of partnership triangles for South-South-North
44	cooperation and Public-Private-CSO partnerships for financing;
45	(b) The creation of multilateral support platforms that allow for policy
46	dialog on public-private partnerships and Southern development
47	knowledge;
48	(c) Development of additional resources for the transfer of technology such
49	as the successful implementation of the WIDE program.
