SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Human Rights in the Administration of Justice

The Third Committee

1 *Guided* by the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights, and Rights of the
2 Child which guarantees the protection of all children worldwide,
3

4 *Recalling* the United Nations Charter which necessitates that the United Nations
5 cannot overstep national sovereignty,
6

7 *Acknowledges* the progress of Member States' inclusion of Human Rights for
8 Children within their own sovereign justice systems,
9

10 *Recognizing* the United Nations' past efforts and accomplishments regarding its
11 commitment to underprivileged children,
12

13 *Congratulating* the individual efforts of member states and their support of the
14 importance of this issue and its relation to social and economic development,
15

16 *Noting* with concern the correlation between underprivileged children and human
17 trafficking and violations of the law,
18

19 1. *Requests* the Secretary General to establish, within 30 days of the adoption of
20 this resolution, a Special Rapporteur to investigate the current standard of living for
21 orphans in cooperative member states and accomplish the following tasks:

22 (a) Evaluate both the social need and economic need of participating
23 states;

24 (b) Analyze the current administration of justice pertaining to juvenile
25 criminals with specific concern for underprivileged children;

26 (c) Report back to the committee within six months of the findings;

27 (d) Assess these findings and allow the committee to determine regions
28 of priority;

30 2. *Encourages* interested member states to collaborate with Non-Governmental
31 Organizations to improve conditions for orphans within their state by:

32 (a) Informing governments and social workers of possible methods to

33 improve conditions;
34 (b) Providing food, shelter, and clothing for children in need;
35 (c) Encouraging further governmental oversight of child protection
36 services;
37 (d) Preparing underprivileged and displaced children to re-enter society by
38 instructing them of the rules governing their state to prevent future violations;

40 3. *Recommends* that states further assist other member states with the mutual
41 understanding that displaced children are of international humanitarian concern.
